

Thomas Price's "Will"

In the Name of God Amen. I Thomas Price of Johnston County in the State of North Carolina being very sick and dead in body but of perfect mind and memory and full in mine the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to do mate and ordain this to be my last will and testament and principally of all I do send my soul to hand of Almighty God who gave it to me. nothing concerning but a the resurrection of the just I shall receive the same with power. My body I give to dust from whence it came to be buried at the discretion of my executors and as such worldly estate as it has pleased God to bless me with I give and dispose in manner and form following.

Item I give and bequeath to my eldest son Thomas Price the plantation on where I live with all the land thereunto belonging and one Negro woman named One negro girl named Rose one negro man named Isaac and five Cows one sorrel colt named Pearce and feather bed and furniture and one mare and colt if she lives to bring it and five Head of Sheep one iron pot one half of my working tools one rifle gun and one fourth part of all my house hold goods

Item I give and bequeath to my youngest son Ezekiel Price the land lying on both sides of the great branch joining my own line and Joseph Price containing six hundred acres likewise I give one Negro girl named Sarah one Negro boy named Lenmon and the first Negro child the Negro woman named Weston Price and one Negro woman named Susan and five Cows and calves one colt and my black mare with the rest mare colt of the aforesaid black mare five Head of Sheep one iron pot the other half of my working tools one feather bed and furniture and one fourth part of my house hold goods + one Smack

Item I give and bequeath to my eldest daughter Rebekah Price one negro man named Harry one Negro woman named after one widow named Rachel two hundred acres of land lying on the road joining my own line and Dancy Clarks & Stephen Vaughn's line, five Cows and calves five Head of Sheep & one black mare named Fly one iron pot one feather bed and furniture and one fourth part of my house hold goods

Item I give and bequeath to my youngest daughter Priscilla Price one negro man named Jack one Negro girl namedannah one Negro girl named Mary six hundred and forty acres of land lying on great Buffalo the south side joining Samuel Smith and old Mr. Seecy lines, five Cows and calves five Head of Sheep one feather bed and furniture one black mare named Tip one acre and the other fourth part of my house hold goods all the out parts of my estate as well as with out doors as within I desire to be sold and as much of the money as shall be wanting to school my children and the remaining part to be equally divided amongst my children further more I constitute and appoint Samuel Smith and John Howell as my executors to this my last will and testament witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 6th day January 1781
