I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth and Anderson Pool her husband the following negroes one negro man Jerry one negro woman Niecey and children Harriet, Guilford Tony & Amy during their natural life and at their death the said Elizabeth and Anderson Pool her husband to be equally divided between their children William Chandley, John Fabius, Anderson Sidney, Elizabeth and Mary Adelaide Pool.

Item

I give and bequeath unto my two grand daughters Mary and Louenza the children of my beloved daughter Mary deceased and her husband Willis Turner two negro girls Lizzy & Patsy hereby revoking and making utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.

In witness whereof I the said John Beddingfield do hereunto set my hand and seal this sixteenth day of November A. D. 1857. Signed sealed published and declared by the said John Beddingfield to be his last will and testament in the presence of us who at his request and in his presence do subscribe our names as witnesses thereto.

## Will of Westbook Langston

A. Langston one negro man named Riley during her life or widowhood, and after the death of my wife all my lands to be equally divided between my three sons James W. John W. and Isaac W. Langston here and share alike also one bedstead and furniture to be given to each of my two daughters namely Sarah W. & Angelina L. Langston and the residue of all my (property) estate if any at the death of my wife to be sold together with my negro man Riley to be equally divided between all my children to share and share alike and my negro girl named Jerry at my deceased to be sold to pay off all my just debts and the remaining part of the money if any left in the hands of my executor to be applied to the use of my wife and children in schooling &c.

I appoint my worthy friend Robert T. Hood my executor to this my last will and testament to all intent and purposes to act according to his judgment and according to law in the settlement thereof and I the said Westbook Langston do hereunto set my hand and seal this January 29<sup>th</sup> 1858.
