In the Name of god amen I Richard
Whitenton son of the County of Johnson
and State of North Carolina being in a good
Stat of health and mind and memory thanks
be given to god calling to mine the mortality
of my body knowing that it is appointed
for all men once to die do make and ordaine
this my last will and testament that is
to say principally and first of all I give my
Wife Nancy Whitenton one feather bed and bed
and furniture one cow and calf one year old cote
one dish 1 bason 2 plates 2 spoons 1 tub and pale
one iron shuffel one piggins I lend unto my wife
Nancy Whitenton these articles to wit one Dutch oven
one dish one bason 2 plates 2 spoons 1 cup 1 pated piggins
one ar to belong to her her life time or wider how
also I give and bequath to my son Solomon Whitenton
one saw also I give my daughter Crecy Auston one
bed also to Mary Wilcar fifty cents five Shillings
also I give unto Sally manore five Shillings
also I give my son Richard Whitenton five Shillings
also I give my son James Whitenton five Shillings
also I give my son Jonathan Whitenton one iron ^{working}
also I give my daughter Peggy Johnson one pare of fire
also I give and bequath to my son William Whitenton
one spare bridle and saddle one iron bound pare of
Carte wheels & cart one cow & calf and the balance of
my and all my plantation working tools and
all my hous hold and kitching furniture
and all my moveable property after paying my debts

That I leave at my death and the property that I have
to my wife ~~Ann~~ Whitenton is at her death or the
end of her widowhood is to belong to my son
~~Wm~~ Whitenton his heirs or assigns ~~and~~
by him freely to be possessed and enjoyed and
I do her by disclaim revoke and disannul all and any
every other testament wills legacies bequests
and executors by me in any wise fore mentions
willed and bequeathed ratifying and confirming
this and no other to be my last will and
testament in witness whereof I have here unto
set my hand and seal ~~Done~~ October the
30th 1819
