

Will of John Brown

In the name of God Amen. John Brown of the County of Johnston
and State of North Carolina being in a less state of bodily health
but of a sound and disposing mind and memory thanks be to God do
make publish and ordain this to be my last will and testament
in manner and form following to wit-

Item

I leave to my loving wife two hundred acres of land lying
and being on the south side of great Buffalo Swamp taking
the house and plantation to her her lifetime or widowhood after
that to belong to my son Adam Brown all the balance of my
land to my loving wife her lifetime or widowhood after that to
be equally divided between Thomas Brown and Stephen Brown
I leave my mill and blacksmith tools to be equally divided
between all my sons after I and my wife's decease.

I give to my son Adam Brown six ewe and calf also two rams
and lambs all the balance of my stock of all kind to my loving
wife her lifetime or widowhood after that to be equal divided
between all my children.

Also give to my grandson Redham Brown my hunting gun
I also leave to my wife all my household and kitchen furniture
her lifetime or widowhood and then to Adam Brown also my cide
casks to Adam Brown also all my working tools to my son
Adam Brown also my grind stone to Adam.

I hereby constitute and appoint my son Thomas and Stephen
executors to this my last will and testament in witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the sixth day of
August A.D. 1844. Signed sealed published and declared to be his

Will of Wilsey Barber

I Wilsey Barber of the County of Johnston and State of North Carolina
being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty
of my earthly existence I make and declare this to be my last
will and testament in manner and form following
That my executors hereinafter named shall provide for my body a
decent burial suitable to the wishes of all my friends and
relations and pay all funeral expenses together with my just
debts whatsoever and whomever owing out of the money that
may first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my
estate

I give and devise to my daughter Lucy H. Johnson one feather
bed and furniture and one side board and one chest and one
side saddle and one wooden wheel and one large dutch oven
and one shot.

I give and devise to my youngest daughter Sarah C. Johnson
one feather bed and furniture and one red chest and one o
ther small chest and one looking glass and one wooden wheel
and one small dutch oven and all the weaving gear and all
kitchen furniture to be equally divided between my two
daughters Lucy H. Johnson and Sarah Johnson and one shot
apiece.

I give and devise to my two sons Elbridge and Henry
Johnson one mare and cart all my plow and cart gear
and one shoot apiece and to my youngest son Henry C.
Johnson one saddle and bridle to be furnished out of my
estate

I give and devise to my daughter Mary Barber one cow and
calf and one griddle and one blue sow and one shot.

I give and devise to my daughter Susan Johnson one bowful
one table and one shot.

I give and John Barber \$2 the sum of five dollars to
be paid out of my estate.

My will and desire is that all the residue of my estate
if any after taking out the devises and legacies above
mentioned shall be sold and the debts owing to me collected
and if there should any surplus over and above the pay-
ments of debts expenses and legacies that such surplus sha
be divided and paid over to all my children in equal pro-
portion and share alike to them and each and every of them
their executors administrators and assigns forever.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved
son Elbridge A. Johnson my lawful executor to all intent and

purposes to execute the my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I the said Wiley Barker do hereby set my hand and seal this the 26th day of June A.D. 1846. Signed sealed published and declared by the said Wiley Barker to be his last will and testament in the presence of us who at his request and in his presence do subscribe our names as witnesses thereto

Will of Starling W. Temple

Know all men by these present particularly those who may consider themselves interested that I Starling W. Temple of the County of Johnson and State of North Carolina sensible of uncertainty of human life am anxious whilst I am in sound mind and of disposing memory to make satisfactory disposition of the property which I may die seized of and possessed do therefore make and ordain publish and declare this instrument of writing to be and contain my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills made by me.

3rd

I bind to my wife Amy Temple during her life (should she survive me) two hundred acres of land including my residence and my will and desire it that my neighbors Robert J. Moseggill, Starling Glassingill Bargilla Blackmon and Peter R. Temple shall allot and set apart for the use of my wife aforesaid during her life such articles of my household and kitchen furniture as they shall deem necessary and convenient for her and that they give her out of my stock crop and provisions a sufficient support for one year for herself and family and that they put her in possession of the same together with her saddle to be used by her during her natural life and at her death such articles of perishable property as is herein allotted as may be allotted (by my friends above named) together with its increase be sold and the proceeds arising thereon be equally divided among all my children.

2nd

I give and bequeath to my son Starling Temple one tract of land adjoining the tract Johnson & now reside beginning in Starling Moseggill line at a stake against the head of Slim Branch thence east with said Moseggill line to against the head of

the Marsh Branch thence the various courses of the Marsh Branch to great Juniper thence down the swamp to Barna Dunn corner thence up a small branch near Abe Ellis to a row of marked trees thence with said trees to Clem Bakers line near his corner thence his line west about to a stake thence north to a stake in James Bakers fresh ground fence thence north with James Bakers line to my own corner thence west with James Bakers line to his corner near a small branch then to the run of great Juniper across the run in such a direction and so far as to make forty acres in a square as near as may be above the Spring branch from the run of said juniper then east to the spring branch thence up the said branch to a small branch called the slim branch thence up the slim branch to the beginning with all and singular its rights and appurtenances forever also I give him the said Starling E. Temple his choice one of my horses one bridle and saddle one cow and calf two sons and pigs two ewes and lambs one bed and furniture one shot gun to have and to hold to him and his heirs forever.

I also give and bequeath unto my two sons (viz) Starling E. and Burwell a small tract of land on Black Creek known as a part of the Barker tract beginning at or in the corner against the oaks branch then about east or as my line runs two hundred and fifty poles to a stake thence north forty six poles to Black Creek William Bryan line thence up the courses of said creek thirty poles to William Bryan corner thence his line north forty five poles to a stake Benjamin Langster corner thence with Lancaster line west one hundred and ninety two poles to a black gum on the run of said creek his and David Smiths corner now J. Kennedy's thence up the meanders of said creek to an old sweet gum log above the mouth of gum branch thence as the course of the swamp to the meadow branch and from thence to the beginning to them and their heirs forever.

Also give and bequeath unto my two sons as above named all my working tools to be divided between them cedar caskets also and the like to them.

Also I give Starling E. ten dollars in money to the use of him. I give Burwell eighteen dollars for to improve his education I give and bequeath unto my daughter Susan Blackman all my land above the wild cat branch and adjoining the Rappahannock Land and Durham Land.

I give unto my daughters (viz) Polly, Sally & Penelope one tract of land lying on Black Creek known as a part of the Barker tract beginning at or near a gum log above the mouth
