Will of William Carroll

Georgia

In the name of God Amen I William Carroll of the state of North Carolina and Johnston County feeling and indisposition of body but of perfect sound mind and memory thanks be to God for calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give and devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form

First- I give and bequeath to Sarah my dearly beloved wife all that part of my estate that now exist in the State of N. Carolina and Johnston County at the present place of my residence which I received with or acquired by a in virtue of my marriage with said Sarah consisting of personal property (viz) three negroes Soby and his wife Liddy and her child Lucy

A small stock of horses and cattle &c
The residue of my property at the said place of my residence I desire that it should be sold and the money equally divided amongst all my children whom I shall hereafter mention if any there is after all lawful expences paid.

Also I give to my daughter Mary & William Hunt three hundred dollars cash to be placed out of my estate

Also I give to my daughter Bethania & Edward Prather three hundred dollars cash

I also give to my grandchildren the orphans of my son John Carroll deceased two hundred dollars cash to be equally divided amongst them when they come of age.

I give to the lawful issues or issue of my son Mitchel Carroll and Sarah his wife my negro George and seven cows and calves and two featherbeds one with furniture and one without the said Mitchel to have the use of the above mentioned property but not to dispose of it in any manner whatever and five hundred dollars to be paid to said issue or issues when of age

Also I give to my son James Carroll three negroes viz,
Pheasant and two of her children Dave and Jane

Also I give to my son William Carroll four negroes, named
Jim, Hale-Sam and Skinner. Also I give to the said William
Carroll and James jointly all and singular lands and tenements
and appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging together with
all the residue of my personal property by them freely to be
possessed and enjoyed.

Also I likewise constitute and make the said William
Carroll the sole executor of this my last will and testa-
ment.

And I do hereby utterly totally revoke all and every former
testamentary wills, legacies and executors &c by me in any wise
before named and willed, satisfying and confirming this to be first

my last will and testament.

Will of Moses O'Neal
State of North Carolina Johnston County

In the name of God Amen, I Moses O'Neal not being in
in perfect health but sound in mind and memory calling
to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it
is appointed for all men once to die I do make and
ordain this to be my last will and testament that is to
say first of all

I give my soul into the hands of God who gave it
and my body to be buried in a decent manner at the
discretion of my executors and as touching my worldly estate
wherein God hath blessed me with in this life I give
and devise and dispose in manner and form as follows

of all I lend to my beloved wife Nancy O'Neal
one negro fellow by the name of Angus one negro
woman by the name of Peg one bay mare one sorrel
mare two cows and calves nine head of sheep and fif-
teen head of hogs one grubbing hoe two weeding hoes two
cutting axes one cart and the gear one hundred and
fifty acres of land including the houses on it two
woollen wheels and cards one flax wheel one feather bed and
furniture two pots five pewter dishes and twelve pewter
plates four earthen plates three pewter basins one chest
one case of knives and forks six chair frames two tubs
two pails one hunting saddle one pan one skillet one
mans saddle two pillows and gear during her natural life
or widowhood and after her decease to come into my
estate again and to be sold and equally divided between
William O'Neal, Willsey O'Neal, John O'Neal, Obedience O'Neal and
Nancy O'Neal all but the land that I leave to my
son Willsey O'Neal.

I give to my daughter Martha Johnston forty shillings
and to each of her children begotten of her body forty
shillings a piece.

I give to my daughter Obedience O'Neal one feather bed
and furniture and two cows and calves and the child
the negro woman by the name of Peg is big with
and if she looses it the next one she brings to good.

I give to my daughter Nancy O'Neal one feather bed
and furniture two cows and calves and one negro girl
by the name of Charlotte
