In the Name of god Amen I Abraham Tabor of Jones County and State of North Carolina being at this time in reasonable health in body and perfect mind and memory do make constitute and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following first my Will is that what house goods I left on horse branch in hancover County be Equally divided between my two sons John Tabor and Bexly Tabor item I also give to my son Josiah Tabor after my decease all that is in his possession item I give to my son Ethel Tabor one bed that he has already and a pear of iron Wedges at Thomas Weatherston item I give to my son in law Thomas Weatherston all the rest that he has in his hands Lastly I nominate and appoint my son Josiah Tabor my Executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other Wills by me made and acknowledge this to be my only last Will and Testament given under my hand and seal this 23rd April 1801 Signed in presence of our
