plates one Barn plow after a consideration the negro Arthur I sent to
my wife I give the S. brother unto her and her heirs for ever And the
child John Belonging to them also one Ark and Two hoes also all my
Stock of Cows & also one Chist and on Case also Two Bedsteads
and cords and one Table four Chairs and two Flat Irons and
Two sides of Leather and one Dutch Oven one pan and Skillet one
Sifter and a torch an Locom and Give one Side Saddle and Bridle
