after my just debts are paid whether consisting at the time of my death of money
bills & stocks Household & Kitchen furniture or property of any description whatso-
ever to be paid immediately to his heirs without any sale (except at his own option)
or without any reservation on account of his being under age to him his heirs and
assigns for ever —

And lastly I nominate and appoint my said son (Daniel C. Hanly)
Executor to this my last will & Testament revoking all other wills by me made
heretofore —

And finally I Recommend my soul & body to that Being who gave them me
firmly believing that he will raise me again at the great last day & if found worthy
will give me a glorious immortality —
