this time in Pungo County in North Carolina being sensible of the certainty of Death & the uncertainty of the time & manner of it & in order to prevent disputes that might arise with regard to the distribution of the small property the most merciful God has been pleased to bestow upon me do make this my last Will & Testament.

Item. After all my just & lawfull debts being just paid I give & beleave
of following:

Item. I give & bequeath unto Catharine Stanley daughter of John Stanley
Esquire of Newburn one full lot of ground in the Town of Newburn
joining Edward Graham esquires with the improvements theron to her
and her heirs & assigns for ever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my aunt Elizabeth Argyle one Negroe
Woman named Philomena & her Child named Major to her & her
Heirs & assigns for ever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto Piggy Bray daughter of Anthony &
Bray two Negroe Women named Grace & Nelly to her & her
Heirs & assigns for ever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto Edward Stanley Esquire son of John
Stanley deceased two plantations situated in Onslow County known
by the Great quarter and hundred fields with all the lands
pertaining unto them together with all the property belonging
to said two plantations as they are at this time as also all the
live stock of every description plantation tools of every kind to
him & his Heirs & assigns for ever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto William Stanley late son of Joseph Bill
Esquire two Negroe fields one named & known by Old Abram
the other by Blacks with Abram to him & his Heirs and assigns
for ever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my good Friend Joseph Bill wherein
by some surcease, Wrists & Saddle to him & his heirs and
assigns for ever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my good friend William Ferrer Esq;
my schooner Capt named Catharine with all her appurtenances
belonging or anywise appertaining to him his heirs and assigns
for ever. —

Item. I give & bequeath unto my aunt Anne Stanley widow of
my late Uncle John, twenty dollars for the express purpose
of being equally divided betwix her & her Children, Share and
Share alike to them & their Heirs forever. —

Item. I give & bequeath unto Edward Starky young son of H. H. Starky
Esquire of Onslow County two plantations in Onslow County known
by my hammock plantation including Bills place &
all my lands adjoining, and my appurtenances thereto
and of my property lying on this land —

Trust, With all the improvements thereto belonging & in any sum
pertaining With all & my one of my Negroes living on said
Land only such as I give their freedom to only myself, with &
together with my share of her stock (one horse, Sheep & two cows
& Cales excepted) and my other movable thereto belonging as also one
other plantation called Duckings & the land of about of my kind adjoining
said plantation With all & my one of the Negroes belonging
to working on said land that is not otherwise disposed of her stock
of all kinds & all movable property of any description also all
my property lands in said County when ever it may also one lot in
the town of Newburgh between Chestnut & Duckings now been
now stands to him & his heirs & assigns for ever.

Item I give & bequeath unto Edward Starkey Jones son of Hilly Jones
inquire of Boston County all the plantation & part of Land in
Jones County between I now live together with all the Negroes
belonging or living on said plantation that is not otherwise given
about with the her stock of any description whatever & all
plantations whatsoever to him & his heirs & assigns for ever. —

Item It is my will & my most evident wish & desire that the following
Negroes (8) One Negro man Affer his wife Suck & their youngest
Daughter Francy together with one old woman named Pleasant &
her daughter Rachel & Rachels Child Solomon one old woman now
Nancy & one man now named David be set free & set in the
most strict manner request & require my executors hereafter men-
tioned to fulfill & complete this my request by setting them at full
freedom & that they & each of them is to enjoy full & clear ample
freedom for & during their natural lives & their increase for ever.
and for their better maintenance & support while enjoying the
Blessing of freedom I give unto Affer Suck & Francy during the
the life time of Affer & Suck a sufficient quantity of ground
or Hills field for them to occupy also I give them four or six
Cows & Cales & one Barn named Sheepers & are to live under the
care & kind treatment of good usage of Edward Starkey Jones
who I am pleased to give the bulk of my property both real
& personal to the aforesaid Pleasant & Rachel Solomons Nancy
and David has ample care & good right by this my last Will
and Testament to live on to occupy & enjoy so much of my
land in the old place such otherwise known by the Bluff
near the family burying ground for and during their natural
lives observing to make no want whatever only for their
plantation use & I do most solemnly charge & require my
good friends named in this my last Will to pay to those
poor colored people close attention so that should they or either
of them need any support that they may receive it by these
ample funds for their necessary support & maintenance &
that I know it it would be mortifying to my feelings to
know that these poor people should be wanting the necessities
of the life & not obtain it.

Item I give & devise unto Edward Starkey Jones son of Hilly Jones
the place Land containing six hundred acres to the same more or
less known by the Bluff the same lying in Boston County to him
& his heirs for ever. —

Item I give & bequeath unto Edward Starkey Jones son of Hilly Jones
all & my one of my Negroes following that has not already
been given away to him & his heirs & assigns for ever.

Item I give & bequeath unto Hilly Jones Children the following
Negroes Sofy & her four children to be equally divided between
the Negros Hilly, Emanuel, Nicholas Hunter, & Catharine Starkey
Shant & shall abide to them & their heirs for ever. —

Item I give & bequeath unto Edward Starkey Jones son of Hilly Jones
all the remainder part of my Estate both real & personal that
has not before in this my last Will & Testament been given away
including all my Arms Rob Goods & furniture of any description
and Household to him & his heirs & assigns for ever.

Item It is my Will & desire that no part of my Arms Rob Goods
and furniture shall be sold at Vansur or otherwise under any
pretense whatever as there will be no necessity for selling any
part of my Estate for the payment of my just Debts as the
present & ensuing Crop of Corn &c. will be ample sufficient to
discharge all my just Debts.

Item As the way (God forbid other should) may stand after
my death in the will be the formerly made such will or
any other that may be brought forward for probate after I
depart this life except this present one I do disavow deny
& revoke to all intents & purposes & only acknowledge accept
& recognize this my last Will & Testament by me made &
done — It is my will & desire that the Negroes belonging
to each plantation & before separated live & continue on the plan-
tations & work under overseers to be appointed over them from year
to year unto Edward Starkey Franks & Edward Starkey Jones
shall over to the full age of twenty one years & then take
possession of their Estates both real & personal & the employ
ensuring after a sufficiency for the support of the plantation to
go towards the clothing & support of the said boys to wit
Edward Starkey Franks and Edward Starkey Jones. —

In consideration of the good opinion I have & bear for
William Perron & Hilly Jones inquires of Boston County do
make constitute & appoint my self & soul Executory to act
up to & comply and fulfill my this last Will & Testament
in every direction whatever that is mentioned herein.

In Confirmation of this being my last Will and Testament
I sign my Name this 5th day of November in the year
of our Lord and Christ One thousand eight hundred and
sixty — signed date & delivered as his
last will & Testament in presence of us —

thank b. to God, calling to mind the mortality of my
body and knowing it is appointed for all men once
to die do make & ordain this my last will & Testament

to kill this season to her her Heirs executors and assignors
for ever — I further give & bequeath unto my son the
Abraold Con all my land that I die possessed of &
one shot gun & two pounds in money to her his
Heirs executors and assignors for ever — I further give &
bequeath unto my daughter Betsy Parry ^{the right of} to her her Heirs
^{she can under no consideration pay her less than £1000, to her further}
executors and assignors for ever — my wife and said
Further is that after all my just debts are paid that the

remainder of my estate to be equally divided between my wife
and all my children —
And partly I nominate & ordain constable & appoint my
son William Con & my friend Rane Loring Esq to
this my last will & Testament — In witness whereof
