I Edward. Mumford, of the County of Jones, Planters, now being in low state of health, but in perfect mind and memory, and calling to mind that all men must die, therefore I make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament. (viz.) principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soul unto the hands of God, who gave it, & my body to the earth, to be buried in a Christian & decent like manner, to and after my just debts is paid.

Item. I give to my Wife Elizabeth, Six chairs, her choice, and Six flay bottom chairs, one dozen of teaspoons, half dozen table, one bed, bedstead Furniture her choice

Item. I wish my negroes, to be equally divided between my Wife and daughter, Maria. And if my daughter, dies before she comes of age, or have a child lawfully begotten of her body, to be equally divided between my brother Frederick Foy, children

Item. I give all my Land, to my daughter, and if she dies before she has a child, lawfully begotten, of her body, and to live, to descend to my brother Frederick Foy, children to them their heirs and assigns for ever. —

Item. I give to my Cousin A. W. Simmons one ^{Gold} ~~the~~ Watch.

Item. I give to my Cousin, A. Foy, one Horse, calved here, and one Humane fifty dollars.

Item. I give to my Cousin Elizabeth Foy, one Humane fifty dollars.

I hereby revoke, and make void, all other Wills and testaments, by me made, before, and acknowledge this to be my last, as witness my hand and seal, this 18th day of May 1828.
