 Item, I give to my son, Saunders Simmons all the lands I hold on
 the South side of Crooked Run joining his own lands to Hatch's as far
 as the long Branch commonly called Antoinette's Branch to him
 his heirs & assigns for ever
 Item, I give to my Daughter, Polly Simmons the Slave Plot of ground
 in Trenton known in the plan of said town by a 1229 twenty nine
 one Negro Woman named Hannah, one Cow & calf, one feather Bed &
 furniture, to her, her heirs & assigns for ever
 Item, I give to my son in law, John Hester one hundred & four acres
 of land on the South side of Trent River from the head of Meads down
 Branch, to him his heirs & assigns for ever
 Item, I give to my Daughter, Elizabeth Simmons one hundred
 acres of land on the South side of Trent River known by the Name
 of Reesons one Negro boy named Willis, one Cow & calf, one
 feather Bed & furniture to her, her heirs & assigns for ever
 Item, I give to my Daughter, Prudence Simmons the land whereon
 Richard Morris now lives on the South side of Trent River on the lower
 side of Long Branch joining Lucinda Simmons, James & John's land, by
 collocation & cetera, also one Negro Woman named
 Jack, one Cow & calf, one feather Bed & furniture, to her, her heirs
 and assigns for ever
 Item, I give to my son in law, Charles Westra one hundred & fifty
 acres of land on the South side of Trent River joining Lipsey's others,
 to him, his heirs & assigns for ever
 Item, I give to my son, Thomas Simmons the Slave Plot whereon I now
 live on the East side of Cherry Street together with all the lands I hold above
 Cherry Street on both sides of the River which I purchased of John
 Richards & others, except that lot given to Polly Simmons I also give
 to my son, Thomas Simmons one Negro Man named Jack, one
 Cow & calf, one feather Bed & furniture, two ploughs, two Axes, two
 Axes, six Chairs, one Table, what stockery is in the house, also my little Gun,
 but should my son Thomas die without heir lawfully begotten of her
 body, then I desire that can the slaves, lots and lands above willed to him
 to be equally divided among all my surviving children, according to
 him, his heirs and assigns for ever
 And the residue of my Estate of what kind soever to be sold all
 my just debts paid, the remainder of the profits, arising from the sales
 with what money, I do have and do collect to be equally di-
 vided among all my surviving Daughters
 Lastly, I hereby make, constitute, appoint my son, Saunders Simmons
 and my son in law, John Hester, Executors of this my last Will and
 Testament, hereby revoking and making void all any other Will by me
 made, ratified, confirmed or otherwise in any other
 In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 3d day

 Item, I give & bequeath to my beloved Wife one Horse named Jack,
 two Cows & calves, one four years old Stear, six head of sheep, a suffi-
 ent quantity of provisions for her support for one year, one new feather Bed,
 all my glass & bellows that are on hand, also all my Sea water, to her & her
 heirs for ever
 Item, I give and bequeath to my Wife during her natural life
 two Negroes named Jim & Hannah a part of my plantation whereon I
 now live from a ditch that is on the South side of the House to the North,
 including the dwelling house & all the out & in buildings & the timber
 adjacent to, may contain the same, one pair of fine dogs, all my Chairs and
 tables, two iron pots, one large, the other small, of tin, stoves to suit
 on the premises, but if not, then I give unto my Wife in the lieu of said
 plantation & furniture one hundred & twenty Dollars to be paid her in cash
 by my Executors I also send my Wife two Sacks of sugar one Chest
 during her natural life
 Item, I give & bequeath unto my son, Stephen Simmons all my
 lands, except one piece on the South side of Meads Branch to Steel's
 corner Calk, also all the Negroes he has now in his possession that I have
 a right to, one half of my flock of cattle that I buy not particularly
 mention in bequest hereafter, also all the property that I have lent my
 Wife, after her decease, or removal, except the two Negroes Jim & Hannah,
 also one large Bible, one Table, also one half of my Stock of sheep,
 to him, his heirs and assigns for ever
 Item, I give and bequeath unto my Daughter, Elizabeth Morris one
 half of my flock of sheep, also one hundred & 20 Dollars in Money, to her and
 her heirs I also give said Elizabeth one black Horse named Stephen
 to her & her heirs for ever I also send my daughter Elizabeth
 Morris during her natural life three Negroes named Peter, Patsie
 & John, also one other Negro named Jim, after the death of my Wife
 Item, I give and bequeath unto my son, John Simmons one Negro named Sam, one hundred
 Dollars in Money to him, that of his or survivors I also give unto
 John Simmons one feather Bed to her and her heirs
 Item, I give & bequeath unto my Grand son, Old Simmons one Sack
 of Rice, his land and his Negro of assigns
 Item, I give and bequeath unto my grand Daughter, Prudence Morris
 one half of a Negro Boy named a Pitt, also fifty Dollars in Money, also
 two Cows, to her, her heirs and assigns
 Item, I give & bequeath unto my Grand daughter, Sarah Oldfield
 the other half of a Negro Kid, one black Mare called a Don, two Cows & calves
 and forty Dollars in Money, to her & her heirs & assigns
 Item, I give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter, Fanny Oldfield
 one Negro Girl named a Hannah, after the death of my Wife, to her & her
 heirs, and in case of her death before her arrival of age or marriage, to her
 Brothers and Sisters of the whole blood
 Item, I give and bequeath unto my grand son, Buckner Oldfield one piece
 of land beginning at a Cypress Marsh, where the fence crosses Meads's
 Branch, and runs with the fence South 35 West to the Main Road, then
 with the Road to the Mill, then with the Run to the back line of John
 Simmons's patent, then with the patent line to Steel's line, then the corner
 of his line to go Calk, one Negro boy named a branch, then down the Waters of said
 Branch to the beginning, to him, his heirs and assigns for ever
 Item, I give and bequeath unto my grand children, John & Prudence
 of Edmund Oldfield one hundred & twenty five Dollars, to them and their
 heirs or survivors in case of death before their arrival of age
 Then cut

Item, I give and bequeath unto my Grand Children Sons and Daughters of Fredk. Boy two hundred Dollars in Money, to be paid yearly and by signs of quarters in case of death in one year.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my Grand Child Joseph fifty Dollars in Money, to him his heirs assigns — I wish my wife my dear best friend my half of his debts due me, value and half of the Money on hand after all the Legacies are paid out, to him his heirs and assigns.

Item, My Will & desire is, that all residue of my property & debts due me, and the property that are only lent be, be equally divided between all my Grand Children that are then living at the ratifying of this my last Will, to them their heirs & assigns.

Lastly, I constitute and appoint my son William Simmons my friend Fredk. Foxe executor of this my last Will & Testament with full power to carry the same into effect. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & date first written signed & sealed in presence.

I Thomas Dudley of Jones County being low in life & perfect memory being mindful of Mortality and for the quiet of my family do make this my last Will and Testament In form following chief of all I Command my Soul to God that gentle through the mercy of Jesus Christ my redemption my body to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and as I wish all worldly goods as God hath bin pleased to bless me with I dispose of the same as follows after all my just debts is paid.

Item I give and bequeath to my wife beloved wife Eliza Dudley three negroes by the names of Bridget Bob. & Pig also one bed and furniture one mare by the name of Pigeon & two plow two Chains two Hoes the chain of Hoes four lead shaps two large Silver Spoons & four small ditto and two three year old Horses two three year old Steers three Cows and calves her chain two Sows & pigs and five year old then not marked that runs up the Creek above where I now live one of the Sows is pale blue one and the other a piege back one to her and her heirs & assigns for ever — Item I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Cassey Watson one negro man by the name of Andrew one bed & furniture two Cows & lambs two Cows & calves one Silver Spoon to her & her heirs and assigns forever — Item I give & bequeath to my two youngest Children Eliza Dudley & Elizabeth Dudley all my Lands on Cedar point that I bought of William Hite which land to be equally divided between them to them their heirs & assigns for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my beloved George Dudley Fanny Dudley Thomas Dudley Elizabeth Dudley Eliza Dudley Eliza Dudley and Elizabeth Dudley all the remainder of my negroes that are not already mentioned for them to be hired out for the support of my Children until one comes of age & marries and then for their part to be let off and for the remainder of them to be kept together until the next comes of age & marries and so on until the —
