

In the Name of God Amen I Enoch Fay of the County of Orange
And State of North Carolina ⁵⁵² Seriously Considering the uncertainty of human
Life and Mindful of the obligation upon every man to leave his affairs in
order and being at this time weak of body but of sound mind and
Memory do make and ordain this my last will and Testament. First of all
I commend my soul to that almighty being who gave it to me trusting in the
merit of the atoning blood of Jesus Christ my Saviour that he will give
me a glorious immortality and after my decease I wish my body to
be decently interred &c and as it regards the worldly goods which I have
pleased God to bestow on me I wish it to be disposed of as follows
Item the 1st I give to my beloved wife Rachel Fay two Beds Bedsteads
& furniture to her here and assigns forever and do leave her three
Beds bedsteads & furniture for the use of the Family also leave her my
Barouche & horses Sam & Jim & Harry. I further give her an Secretary
and dozen Chair, two Tables & all the Kitchen furniture to her her Kiloware
assigns for ever. Item the 2^d I give unto my daughter Nancy Stanton
and Negro girl named Hephzibah which I have lately sent her her
hires and assigns for ever having already advanced her in life
Item the 3rd I give unto my son Joseph S. Fay and note of hand which I
hold against him for Ninety two Dollars having already advanced
him in life by due of gift. Item the 4th I give unto my son Miles Fay
the following Namea Negroes Jim, Tom, Anaca & her Children Henry,
Alpha & Jela, Sidney & her Child Lucy to him his hires & assigns forever
Item 5. I give unto my son Charles Henry Fay the following Namea

Negroes Tony, Jada, Oprahain, Harriet, Tilly & Lettie also one tract
of Land lying on Mill Creek & both Sides of Paradise Branch which
I purchased of Miles Fay. Containing about Seven Hundred acres
to him his hires and assigns for ever. Item 6. I give unto my bro
Youngest Son Thomas D. Fay and Franklin Fay all the rest and
residue of my lands to be divided as follows beginning at the mouth
of the Beaver Dam Branch when it enters into the reason Branch running
up the Beaver dam to the market - Bridge & Black gum & Short leaf Pine
thence a strait line to the mouth of Skinner Branch where it enters in
the Beaver. From thence up the various curves of the Skinner Branch to the
Beaufort - Road thence a strait line to the mouth of the East ditch at
the Dana Ridge go thence up the ditch to the Pecosin & along the Pecosin
to my back line Thomas D. Fay to have all the lands I now lying on
the East side of said line & Franklin Fay to have all the lands I now
lying on the West side of said line including the mansion house
wherein I now live to them their hires and assigns forever.

Item 7. I give unto my Son Thomas D. Fay the following Namea Negro
Servis, Dave, Mary, John & Agnes also the set of Blacksmith tools
two Bed & furniture now in his possession to him his hires and
assigns for ever. Item 8. I give unto my Daughter Caroline Fox all
her Bed & furniture one of which is already in her possession having
hitherto advanced her in life by due of gift.

I give the following Name & Negroes to be equally & fairly
divided between my Wif Rachel And my six youngest Children
that is Francis, Blightt, Rebecca, Franklin, Sally And Harriet Fay
& my Slave, Lucy Lamb, Mariah, York, Phyllis & Phillips Moses,
Margaret, Charles, Norris, Charlotte, Rillie, Blunt, Arlo, Mingo,
Rush, Sampson, Carter, Bile, Henry, Miles, Clos, & John Pollard, Rachel,
Mary Nelson, Sip, John Barber, Madam, Dick, Attorney, Books, Oliver
Mahala, George, Abner, Ben, Frank, to them thir heirs And assigns.
for ever. Item 10 I give unto my two Grand Children Mariah & Nock.
Children of James Fay died. Nine Negroes Lucy, Fog, Squine, Garca,
Olja, Phillip Nelson, Marinda, Mingo, & Nella to be equally & fairly
divided between them as they arive of age or marry if either of them should
die before they arive of a yst leaving no issue, thy desire is the surviving
one shall have the whole if both should die leaving no issue then I desire
it shall return to my Children & be equally divided among all my
surviving Children to them their heirs And assigns for ever.
Item 11 My will And desire is that all my Crop Stock Horses, Cattle
Hogs & Sheep Negroes Chola furniture farm & utensile Should be sold
out a Credit of six months And after paying all my just debts &
Necessary expences to be equally & fairly divided between my Wif
And all my surviving Children to them their heirs And assigns.
for ever. Lastly I nominate my two Sons Miles Fay Charles H. Fay
& my friend William Washington of Craven County Executors to this
my last will & testament given under my Hand & Seal this 25th day
of July A.D. 1842.
