to mind the mortality of man, do make and ordain this my last Will and  
Testament in manner and form following —

Item, I leave to my mother Anne Mundine all of my property after my just  
debts are paid off any, and after her death to be equally between my brother & sister  
William Mundine and Hessey Mundine, and if either should die without  
lawfull issue, or both of them, it is my will it should be equally divided  
amongst my nearest relation —

I constitute and appoint Daniel Jackson Esq: to this my last Will  
and Testament revoking all other former Wills by me made at any time and  
declaring this to be my last Will & Testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto  
set my hand and affixed my seal this the 25<sup>th</sup> day of March 1835.—
