I Frederick Isler Butler of the County of Iome & State of North Carolina being  
in a weak on a law condition but of sound and disposing mind memory  
do make & publish this my last Will and Testament in manner & form following  
that is to say

Imprimis I give and bequeath to my Son William Isler Butler all the plant-  
ation & lands bought by me of William D. Cobb two Negro Men Namea  
Jno & George, And horses Call a Scroggins & one more Calla Carolin and  
the gang of Hogs that he feeds on the New road on the new road on the  
Cobb land also five head of dry cattle & five hundred dollars in cash to be  
raised out of my estate if the same shoule not be on hand at my death  
to him his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Eliza bush Mouth three hundred  
dolares in Cash to remain in the hands of my Executor hereafter named and  
to be paid to her at his discretion as he may think she may need.

Item I give to my belona Wife Eliza A. G. Butler during her life all the rest  
of my estate of Every description including all my lands & negroes Not giving  
to my Son William all my Stock of every kind, Household and kitchen furniture,  
Money notes bonds & other chonctes action in short all my property of every kind  
subject to the limitations & conditions herein after mentioned to wit that my said wife

Shall advance upon their marriage or arrival at age to my two Grand Children  
Daughters of my daughter Julia Butler one eighth part of all my Negro slaves  
which I give to them & their heirs, and shall also advance in like manner to all  
my other Children the issue of my marriage with her as they shall arrive at lawful age  
each and eighth of said Negroes which I give to them their heirs & assigns forever & shall  
also advance to my Children the issue of my marriage with her one seventh of all the  
other property given to her for life which I give to them their heirs & those having to  
my said wife one eighth of my slaves after the other slaves are so advanced One  
and seventh of all my other property except the land which after her death I give  
to my his Children the issue of my marriage with her and to the survivors or survivors  
of them and in case of his surviving the time of the arrival of 21 years or more  
of all my Children the eighth of the slaves remaining & the one seventh of the other  
property left I give to my said wife absolutely her heirs to  
It is my will & I do direct that my Children by my last marriage be Educated  
out of the income of the property given to my wife for life, and the necessary funds  
I hereby direct to be used for that purpose.

Lastly I constitute & appoint my Son William Isler Butler Executor of this my last  
will & Testament hereby revoking all other Wills by me before made & comprising  
this as my last will

I Martin Miller of the County of Jones and State of North Carolina  
being in health and sound and perfect memory and knowing that it is  
appertaining for all men and to do here thoughts proper to constitute make and  
ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form to <sup>(buy)</sup>  
first of all I command my soul to God that gave it me and my body to  
be buried at the discretion of my friends.

1<sup>st</sup>. it is my will and desire that all my just debts be honestly and punctually  
paid

2<sup>nd</sup>. I leave unto my son John Miller during his natural lifetime my Plantation  
whereon I now live on Jacks Cabin all I lend him during his lifetime the  
following Negroes to <sup>(buy)</sup> him, Jack, Joe. Mr. Levenia, Miller, Susan, Tim, Dennis  
Nancy, Delia, Moses, Amos, Sam, George, Joe. Mr. Penny, Nancy, Parker, Daniel  
and Alexander. And after his death I give and bequeath unto my daughter  
Sarah Miller to her her heirs and assigns forever all and singular the before  
mentioned property <sup>(buy)</sup> the Plantation whereon I now live on Jacks Cabin also  
the following Negroes to <sup>(not)</sup> him, Jack, Joe. Mr. Levenia, Miller, Susan, Tim,  
Dennis, Nancy, Delia, Moses, Amos, Sam, George, Joe. Mr. Penny, Nancy, Parker,  
Daniel and Alexander, also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah  
Miller two half lots in the Town of Newbern lying on Black Street known in  
the Town Plan by lots N<sup>o</sup> 237 & 228 with their improvements to her her heirs and  
assigns forever.

3<sup>rd</sup>. It is my will and desire that my beloved wife Celia Miller have all my  
house hold & kitchen furniture Plantation tools of every description also all my  
stock of every kind during her lifetime and after her death It is my desire  
that my daughter Sarah Miller have all and singular the stock of all kinds &  
Plantation tools of all kinds that I leave my wife to her her heirs and assigns  
forever.

Lastly I nominate Constitute and appoint my worthy friend Calvin Kooner  
Collector to this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and canceling all  
former wills or wills heretofore by me made and confirming and ratifying this  
to be my last will and Testament in Testimony whereof I have this 5<sup>th</sup> day of December in the year of our Lord 1812.
