I Hannah Perry of the County & State aforesaid being weak in body but of perfect sound mind & memory blessed be God, as this 22nd day of December in the Year of our Lord 1823 make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following (viz)

First I give and bequeath unto my Son Joseph And. certain Negro Boy by the Name of John to him his heirs and assigns forever

Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Hannah Fete six hundred dollars in cash or property as my Daughter Hannah may prefer to her his heirs and assigns forever -

Item My wife and I desire is that all of the residue of my property of what kind or nature soever it be remaining shall be equally divided between all my Children by my Executor hereafter named I have and I have alike as equally as may be. -

I hereby nominate constitute and appoint my Son Joseph Perry my Executor to this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all other wills by me heretofore made -

In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day and year first above written -
