I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Samuel Morris the lower part of my land beginning at the mouth of Policy branch within mentioned running out or up with William Morris line including all the Land below said branch to the river with all the appurtenances there unto belonging or appertaining also one negro boy Simon (Slave) two Cows & Horses with their increase one pewter Dish one basin six Sticks and one good feather bed and furniture to him his heirs and assigns forever commencing after my wife's Death or marriage.

I give to my Daughter Sarah Dillahunty one pewter basin to my Daughter Abby Smyth one pewter basin and to my Daughter Amy Gregory one pewter basin to them their heirs and assigns forever.

I give my will & desire is that one hundred & fifty acres of Land joining William Morrisons and James Green on the south side of Little Cinguspia creek be sold & the money arising from said Land be equally divided between all my Children share and share alike.

I hereby nominate constitute & appoint my Son in Law Rice Rubin and Samuel Dillahunty Executors to this my last will & Testament and hereby disannulling all other wills by me made herebefore in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and face my seal the

day of June within within year signed sealed published and uttered by William Morris (Seal) and at his last will & Testament in presence of us who have subscribed our names as witnesses

In the name of God Amen I James Pyles of the County of Jones and State of North Carolina being sick and weak of body but of sound and perfect sense and memory thank the be to God do make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner & form as followeth First I impious

Send to my beloved wife Mary Pyles all my whole estate real and personal during her natural life or widowhood only such things as shall be hereafter mentioned to the Children  
I give and bequeath to my son John Pyles my land and Plantation I now live on which is one hundred & twenty two in the back ten only excepted to be added to that ninety other on Samuel Bratcher lives also one Cow one bed to him and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Nancy Pyles one bed one Loom and furniture one Cow by name Strawberry.

I give and bequeath to my son James Pyles one hundred and of land with the plantation whereon Samuel Bratcher now lives with the ten acres added which he and John

Pybas is to prohibit this mother from the use of these  
lands & plantation during her life or widowhood to  
him and his heirs forever neither the mother to prohibit  
the owners of the land from the use of it in her life.

Item I leave all the rest of my estate only such things  
as I gave the Children above named which I had  
to her during life or widowhood at her death or marriage  
all those things that I lent her to be equally divided be-  
tween my Daughters Catharine Pybas Henry Pybas William  
Pybas Nathaniel Pybas or otherwise if she should live a  
widow to see the Children grown up to years of age so as to  
leave her the way at her discretion if she can spare it  
help them to things that will best suit them as to  
to disburse with any one more than an other.

Item I leave all my Carpenter and joiners Tools to be  
sold to pay my debts that is all that is justly due.

Item I constitute and appoint my true and trusty friends  
John Pybas & John Parris my heirs and the Executors of this  
my last will and Testament utterly annulling all  
other wills by me made. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto

through the merits of my Redeemer and as for the worldly  
goods which it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow on  
me I give in manner and form following

I give unto my beloved son William Bryan one feather bed  
and furniture. I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved  
son Nathaniel Bryan all that messuage or Tenement of land  
with the appertinances thereto belonging in the Town of  
Newbern whereon he now lives which I hold by Deed from  
John Elder to him the said Nathaniel Bryan his heirs and  
Assigns forever

I give and bequeath to my beloved son  
Isaac Bryan one negro man called George to him his  
heirs and Assigns I give unto my Daughter Mary Smith  
all my wearing Apparel and a suit of mourning to be pur-  
chased for her by my Executors

I give unto my Grand  
Daughter Ann Bryan Daughter of son Thomas Bryan and  
one Gold ring to be purchased for her by my Executors in  
full of her said deceased fathers share of my estate

I give unto my Grand son James Henry Bryan son of my  
son Harry Bryan deceased <sup>one Stationary</sup> to be purchased for him by my  
Executors in full of his said deceased fathers share of my  
estate I give and bequeath unto my beloved son David  
Bryan all the rest and residue of my estate of what nature
