I James Huggins of the County of Jones and State of North Carolina being old and infirm, but of perfect sound mind & disposing memory, and calling to mind the mortality of the body, and that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make & ordain this to be my last Will & Testament in manner & form following (Copy)
Imprimis, My Will & desire is after my death to be decently buried, at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named, and as touching the little worldly goods which it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give & devise as follows, that is to say,
Item, My Will & desire is that my Executors pay out of any monies raised out of my estate (either by sale of property, debts due, or money on hand) all my just debts as well as funeral expenses, which being done I leave unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Huggins for & during her natural life, all the residue of my estate of whatsoever kind it may be, to be used at her own discretion, for the benefit & comfort of her in old age, and after the death of my wife such property as shall then be left or remaining, I wish to be sold at the discretion of my Executors, and the money arising from such sale to be equally divided between my four children, Jacob, Susannah, James, Nancy & Hardy Huggins share and share alike to them their heirs and assigns for ever.
Lastly, I nominate constitute & appoint my friend Benjamin Huggins my whole and sole executor to this my last Will & Testament, and hereby revoking all former Wills by me heretofore made, acknowledging this to be my only last will.
