James Standley of the County of Somersett of North
Carolina Being Sick and weak of Body but of sound
Mind of memory do make and a Oration this my last
Will and Testament in Manner and form following
Vt. — And first I recommend my Soul to almighty
God who gave it me and my Body to the Earth unto the
Resurrection of the just, when I Expect to receive it again
Fashioned like unto Christ of our bodies Body believing in
the Christian Revealed Religion and hope to the Just
Jesus when I am judged because Jesus Christ bore my
Sins in his own Body on the tree of the Cross and was
Sacramentation for sins and as for my Mortal goods that
I have I give of them in Manner and form following
Vt. I give to my son James Standley two hundred acres
of Land on the south side of Great Chenguapen Creek
beginning at the lower part of the plantation whereon now lies
to be laid off from the said Creek Lining planters line
to the Back line of said Land so as to include two hundred
Acres to him and his heirs forever I then give forth
use and Benefit of my six Daughters namely Alice —
Sarah, Elizabeth, Susanna, Margaret, of Mary Standley
the use of fifty acres of Land on the north side of the
Creek I then on and leaving the land that I heretofore
decreed to my son John Standley Lointey so long as they
my said daughters shall remain unmarried
Upon the Marriage of any one or more of my said
Daughters the loss of said Land to bear with respect to
such Child or Children so marrying & to continue to hold
Good to such as remain single During the time they
shall remain single and after the death or Marriage
of my said daughters I give and Bequeath my fifty acres
of Land as above to my son Nathaniel Standley to him
of his heirs forever I then I leave the use and Benefit
of the remainder of my Plantation Including the plantation
House and the Land I bought agreeing wherein Lewis
Carroll formerly lived together with the remt of the old

Plantation to my loving wife Winifred During her natural life
and after her Death I give the said Land with their improvement
to my son Nathaniel him of his heirs forever
Item I give and Bequeath to my three sons John Standley and
Nathaniel all the remt of my Lands to be Equally Divided
among them to hold of their heirs forever
Item I give to my son John two horses Bay & Grey, four hens
and Calves and one Peacock Bird of Plumage,
Item I give and leave all the remainder of my Estate of what
Nature or Kind soever or where ever it may be found not her
below mentioned in this Will first Subject to the pay ment
of my just Debts and then the use and Benefit of the same
I leave to my loving wife Winifred during her natural life
and that she my said wife as long as she maintainance
out of the Income of the same another of the Plantation
Lands for my Children whilst they are under full age one after the
death of my said wife Winifred I give all the said property
not her before given in this will to be Equally Divided and
amongst my six daughters Alice, Sarah, Elizabeth, Susanna
Winifred of Mary and my son Nathaniel to them and
their heirs forever with this promise that if one or more of
my said daughters shall marry before the Death of their
affectionate Mother then it shall be in the power of my
two sons John of James Standley to make of the Estate so left
uninhabited and let of to such such Child or Children so
marrying if they my two sons shall Judge such a division
can be made without splitting the property and
without leaving the inheritance to the family too much which
division if made in the manner above mentioned shall be
good and valid the made before the Death of my wife
Winifred and the Child or Children so taking their share
not again claim any part of a Division after the Death of my
wife as aforesaid — Item I give and Bequeath to my daughter
Lucy Bate five Shillings Currant together with what thereupon
settled on her to be her full share of my Estate and lastly
I do Constitute and appoint my two Sons John of James Standley
Executive to this my last Will and Testament with full

Power and authority to make all the divisions herein mentioned without settling the property in such division & divisions shall be binding on the parties and I do hereby testify this to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 12th April 1793 - the year above written before John Green, subscriber signed his - - - - - and declared in the presence of James S. Standley

I Barrie Williamson of the County of Jones and State of South Carolina Being in a poor state of Bodily health but of perfect mind and sound memory and knowing to whom has it appertained Once forsoothman to die do make & Ordain this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth First of all I commend my Body to the Earth on which it was born of my soul & Begone to God that gave it & as for those uncleanly goods that you hath bestowed on me I leave in manner of sum as followeth I Give and Bequeath to my wife Nancy Williamson two negroes named Tom & named Peggy and also I leave one negro girl called Sally to my wife Nancy Williamson during her natural life

I Give & Bequeath to my wife Nancy one Gray Horse one Bay Mare & Carting likewise all my Plantation tools all my Sheep and Bequeath to my wife Nancy all my house hold furniture of Every kind in Consideration and Consideration my wife Nancy receives a good Father & a good Furniture for each & any of my Children at the period of their Marriage or arriving to the age of Twenty one years old Likewise all my Hogs and Sheep I Give to my wife Nancy until the next marriage Comin to her of her Husbands Bequeath to my wife Nancy the house & land in Consideration and Consideration the house to my wife Nancy Williamson my Dwelling Plantation with the Priviledges there to belonging During her natural life also I Give of Bequeath to my wife Nancy all my Cattle & Cows what is marked in my Childrens - Mark 1. I Give and Bequeath to my son Ethan William son of my hands lying along the Branch called the May Branch also one Bay Horse & one Gun to him & his继承人 Ever - 2. I Give & Bequeath my Son Harry Williamson one piece of Land lying as followeth Beginning at a small Branch in the road near my Plantation running due East to the river of the Black swamp from thence up the swamp to a little line from thence with a old line to another line and thence with another line down to the fork of the Land Head from thence a stray line to a white stone stand near the County Road between two Senate Ponds from thence with the Road to the first Station containing two hundred acres more or less continuing I Give my Son Harry one Small - often also I leave one Piece of Pine Land containing Two Hundred and thirty acres of Pineage land for the support of the before mentioned Lands to them and their heirs and assigns - 3d My will and desire that the rest of my Estate not Will'd already to be left to my wife Nancy during her life and for the support of my children and her Marriage my wife is that the High road laid out for the support and for the use of my children at the Description of my Executors further my Will is that when my Children - each
