I John Bender of the County of Stone and State of North Carolina, Seriously Considering the uncertainty of life and mindful of the obligation upon every man to look after his affairs in order to make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following (viz.)

In nomine. It is my desire that my Executors hereafter named shall liquidate and pay all my just debts.

Item I give to my beloved wife Feraby and negro boy Mama Cenae two black bedsteads and furniture, two pine Tables, two white pine Chests and Box and Calf and two and two years old Calf, two Saws and Pigs if any pigs on hand, two Iron pots and pot hammer, one Tea Kettle, one Spider, one set plates, two dishes, one set knives and forks, one Cup and saucer, one set ^{set} Two iron Chairs, two axes and one hoe, And a pitch oven, two bushels salt, twenty Barrels corn, five hundred pounds of Pork, thirty five pounds of lard, twenty five pounds of brown sugar, ten pounds of Coffey, One loaf of sugar, One pound of Soap and Barrel of Flour, One hundred and forty five Dollars in Cash to her his heirs and assigns forever. I also lend to my wife Feraby during her natural life a Negro woman Mama Beld and a Negro boy Mama Tom.

Item. I give to my Son George J. Bender a negro man named Sam to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give to my Son Bryan Bender a negro man named March to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give to my Son John H. Bender a negro man named Simon to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I leave to my Daughter Mary Wharton and Negro man named Charles, a Negro woman named Doll and Negro boy named Ben during the natural life of her the said Mary Wharton and after her death I give the said Negroes Charles, Doll and Ben to be equally and fairly divided among such Children of the body of her the said Mary Wharton as she may leave to them their heirs and assigns forever,

Item. I give to my Daughter Lucy Cooke a negro woman named Esther a negro boy named Harry and a negro girl named Lucy to her her heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give to my Daughter Brancy Cooke a negro girl named Cook a negro boy named Caesar and a negro girl named Sarah to her her heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give to my Daughter Eliza Parsons a negro man named Thompson and a negro girl named Ann and a negro girl named Lou to her her heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give to my Son Robert H. Bender a negro girl named Pat and a negro boy named Mingo also one big bedstead and furniture, One gun and a horse saddle and saddle, and mare by the name of Dile, Any yoke of oxen two Cows and a large Cart and fifty Dollars in Cash to him his heirs and assigns forever.

at the death of my wife it is my desire that the two negroes loaned to her
estate and now together with the sum of \$100 from this time should be equally and
fairly divided between my daughters Mary Wharton Sidney Weeks Brancy Weeks and
Olivia Parsons to them this time and apoint forever.

Item I give whatsoever Cash and notes I may have on hand at my death after
paying the legacies in each having made to be equally and fairly divided among
my wife's Chattel George S. Bender, Bryan Bender, John H. Bender, Mary Wharton
Sidney Weeks, Brancy Weeks, Olivia Parsons and Robert H. Bender to them their
heirs and assigns forever.

Item It is my will that all the rest and residue of my property not herein devised
or heretofore given by act of gift shall be sold at six months credit and the proceeds
thereof equally and fairly divided between my wife Teraby and my daughters
Mary Wharton Sidney Weeks, Brancy Weeks, Olivia Parsons and my son Robert H. Bender
to them their heirs and assigns forever.

And lastly I nominate and appoint my sons Bryan Bender and John H. Bender
Executors to this my last will and Testament. Finally Commit my body to be
decently interred by my Executors and my soul to that Being who gave it me, not
doubting but by a firm reliance on his Providence and a faithful performance
of their duties which he has made obligatory upon that he will give me a glorious
^{eternal} ~~eternal~~ reward under my hand and seal this 11th day of April A.D. 1842
