 two bullocks & one heifer & all my hogs & two pigs & one
 Hilly & three sitting chickens & two live traps & all my
 Batts also one Beef Cows which it is my will and
 desire that my wife should keep the five children and
 at her death the property to be sold & Equally divided
 among the five children also I leave my seven children
 that I had by my second wife Rachel I leave one Shilling
 each I leave my wife Diannah Antione & her heirs
 my Executors or Administrators I set my hand & seal
 the day & year above written in the presence of —

 Bull & one heifer if they are to be found & one large
 putter dish & one tea kettle & one serrable cash pot to her
 & her heirs forever —
 I give & bequeath to my daughter Bathsheba one
 Knife big with calf one high chair & one low chair and
 one flying pan to her & her heirs forever —
 I give & bequeath to Sarah Taylor one large
 pot to her & her heirs forever —

I will that all the residue of my property that
 is not already mentioned & particular divided be sold &
 all my last debts paid & the residue of the money to
 be equally divided amongst my children —
 Lastly I nominate & appoint my friends Edmund
 Hatch Executor to this my last will & Testament
 revoking all former wills by me made & Confirming
 this —

 to her & her heirs & assigns forever —

Item I give & bequeath unto Peggy [Signature] daughter of Nicholas
 A. May two negro women named Grace & Mall to her
 and her heirs and assigns forever —

Item, I give and bequeath unto Edward Starkey Son of John
 Starkey deceased two plantations situated in Onslow County known
 by the quarter quarter and fourth fields with all the land appurte-
 nant unto them together with all the negroes belonging to said two
 plantations of they are at this time of age all his live stock of
 every description plantation tools of every kind to him & his heirs
 and assigns forever —

Item, I give and bequeath unto William Starkey Will son of John
 Starkey deceased two negro fellows one named & known by
 Old Abram the other by Blacksmith Abram to him & his heirs
 and assigns forever —

Item, I give & bequeath unto my good friend Joseph Will Esq.
 my horse Sorrowbones and saddle to him and his
 heirs & assigns forever —

Item, I give & bequeath unto my good friend Williams Terrance
 one of my Schooner Viper named Catharine with all her
 appurtenances to her belonging or otherwise appertaining to him
 his heirs & assigns forever —

Item, I give & bequeath unto my aunt ^{deceased} ~~Starkey~~ ^{deceased} ~~Starkey~~ ^{deceased} ~~Starkey~~
 of my late uncle John ^{deceased} twenty ^{shares} for the express
 purpose of being equally between her & her children and
 grand children share & share alike to them and their
 heirs forever —

Item, I give & bequeath unto Edward Starkey Son of John
 Jones one quarter of Onslow County two plantations in Onslow
 County one known by the name of ~~the plantation~~ ^{the plantation} including
 both plain & all my lands adjoining thereto with all the
 Improvements thereunto belonging to him or any wise appertaining
 with all & every one of my negroes on said land only such
 as give their freedom to, only excepted with & together with
 every species of live stock (one horse Sorrowbones & his colts &
 being excepted) & every other movable furniture belonging ap-
 also one other plantation called Duddles & the lands of mine
 of every kind adjoining said plantation with all and
 every one of the negroes ^{belonging} on working on said land that is not
 otherwise disposed of live stock of all kinds and all mov-
 able property of every description also all my prime land
 in said County wherever it lies also one lot in the Town
 of Swanborough whereon Christopher Duddles Son of John
 now stands to him & his heirs & assigns forever —

Item, I give & bequeath unto Edward Starkey Son of John
 Jones one quarter of Onslow County all the plantation & tract
 of land in Jones County whereon I now live together with
 all
