tors of this my last Will & Testament, confirmed under my
Hand & Seal this 26th Day of January 1790

Use of what Sows & Pigs that may be left at my Decease, all which
several Articles above mentioned I bequeath to my said Wife during her
natural Life, & at my said Wife's decease I give & bequeath the same
with their Appurtenances to my beloved Daughter Rebecca Lee, to her
Heirs & Assigns for ever —

Item. — I give & bequeath to my Daughter Sally Lee Three Acres
& Calves, provided the said Sally returns to this place, or sends
any lawful Power to receive them for her Use, but in case she
should not return, or send after them, then in such case I give
& bequeath the same to my Daughter Fannie, to her Heirs
and Assigns for ever —

I give & bequeath to my son Stephen Lee the One half Tract
of Peeson Land on Whitlock, & One Cow to him & his Heirs &
Assigns for ever.

I give & bequeath to my son John Lee One hundred & fifty
Acres of Land between Durnin Neck & Peacon Swamp, &
One Cow, to him & his Heirs —

I give & bequeath to my Daughter Fannie Lee One hundred Acres
of Land called Steele's place, whereon I lately lived, together with
all my Household Furniture, plantation Tools, Horses, Cattle &
Hogs herein before lent to my Wife, after my said Wife's Decease
I give & bequeath the same to my said Daughter Fannie, to her
Heirs & Assigns for ever —

It is my further Will & desire that the Residue of my Estate

(247) particularly bequeathed, to pay off my just Debts, and
necessary Expenses he sold for that purpose, & the Residue
thereof, (if any) I give & bequeath to my Wife for her support
Lastly, I nominate, constitute & appoint my Brother
Thomas Lee & my Friend Thomas Roy of Mill Creek to be the
Executors of this my last Will & Testament, ratified & con-

him, his Heirs & Assigns for ever, to be delivered him after my Wife's
decease

I give & bequeath to my son Joseph, One Cow & Calf, one Bar Plough,
one Sheel, one Grubbing hoe, together with what property before given
him, to be delivered him in manner as above mentioned, to him & his
Heirs & Assigns for ever.

I give & bequeath to my Daughter Betia Mullis one Cow & Calf, five
Pewter plates, one Glass Bottle, together with what has been already
given her, to be delivered her as above mentioned, to her & her Heirs & Assigns for ever.

I give & bequeath to my Daughter Barbara Good one Cow & Calf, one large
Trunk, five Pewter plates, &c. & have called for already delivered her, to-
gether with what has been before given her, to her & her Heirs &c. for ever.

I give & bequeath to my Daughter Nancy Granade one Feather Bed,
Bedstead & Furniture of her choice, one Horse & Mare, Saddle &
Bridle, one Linen Wheel, a large Iron pot, a Negroe Woman call'd
Sarah, a large Pewter Basin, a Coffee Mill, a pair of Smoothing Iron,
to her, & her Heirs & Assigns for ever.

I give & bequeath to my Son John Granade a Negroe Man call'd Tony,
a young Horse call'd Tuffy, a Saddle & Bridle, one Bar Plough, one
Sheel, a Grubbing hoe, two Axes, one Feather Bed, Bedstead and
Furniture, & one Gun, to him & his Heirs & Assigns for ever.

I give & bequeath to my Daughter Sally Granade a Negroe Woman call'd
Hannah, a Feather Bed, Bedstead & Furniture known by her, a Linen
Wheel, one Madam Wheel, one Rachel, two Iron pots, a Tea Kettle, a pot-
& Spoon, two Pewter Basins, a pair of Steel Yards, a Mare call'd
Doris, to her & her Heirs & Assigns for ever.

I do hereby declare, that my Wife Margaret Granade shall have the Use
& Benefit of my whole Estate during her natural life or Widowhood, &c.
