There was the last Will and Testament of John McDaniel Sr. dec'd. duly proved
in open Court by the oath of William McDaniel Esq^r at the same time the Executor
therein named duly qualified as such ordered that letters of Testamentary issue
accordingly

In the name of God amen I John Eubank of Jones County
and State of North Carolina being sick and weak in body yet thanks to
God of sound mind and memory of understanding do make and ordain this my
last Will and Testament in the following manner and form viz first it is my
Will that all my just debts be satisfied and paid. —

I will and bequeath unto my beloved son Aron Eubank my house in which I
now live & all the Land on the North side of the Branch which I bought of Isaac
Gibson to him and his heirs forever I also will and bequeath unto my said
beloved son Aron all the property I have in my possession that belonged to his
mother before I married her also one Yoke of Oxen and the Cart that I now own
also Half my Hogs, also one Feather Bed and Furniture to him and his Heirs
forever, I also will and bequeath unto my said beloved son Aron one Negro boy
named Stephen and Five Acres of Land lying between his above mentioned Land
I have willed to him & my son Lewis Land it being part of the Land which
I bought of Elijah Eubank to him and his Heirs forever.

I will and bequeath unto my beloved sons to wit Lot and Ola equally one Negro
woman named Dabillah and her increase if she should have any after the
present date. I also will and bequeath unto my beloved sons Lot and Ola one
negro boy named Ners.

I will and bequeath unto my beloved son Levi Eubank Three Hundred dollars
which I have given him for the boy Donum which I willed to him in my former
Will and then sold him.

I will and bequeath unto my said son Ola Eubank all the Land which I bought of
Isaac Gibson on the South side of the Branch with a small piece of Land in and
Joining the field which I bought of said Gibson not exceeding Ten or Twelve Acres
being part of the Land I bought of Elijah Eubank it is my Will also that my said
son Ola Eubank shall have a road along the line between my Land and Daniel
Eubank's land running through the will to my said son Ola one Hunting Gun.

Item I will and bequeath unto my two beloved sons aforesaid Lot & Asa attorney
lands which I bought of Elijah Eubank except the few acres which I have
already above willed to my said sons Asa & Aaron to be equally divided between
them. Lot having the part next to John Sunmon's line, to them and their Heirs forever.
Item I will unto my beloved daughter Sarah Eubank Twenty Shillings Currency.
Item I will unto my beloved Son Thomas Eubank Twenty Shillings Currency.
Item I also will that the remaining part of my property whatever be equally divided
among my aforesaid beloved sons, to wit, Lot, Levi, Asa, & Aaron & I do constitute
and appoint my aforesaid beloved sons, to wit, Lot, Levi, & Asa Executors to this my
last Will and Testament revoking all other my former Will or Wills by me before
made I do ratify and confirm this to be my last Will and Testament in
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 1st day of
September 1817.

the Plantation Tools Household and Kitchen Furniture all the above of every descrip-
tion during her natural life also my Plantation with the same during her natural
life and at her death the Plantation with what stock and Tools &c belonging and
remaining shall go to and be the property of my son Elisha Stafford giving my
wife free liberty to sell of the Stock and Plantation Tools what she may think proper
Item I give and bequeath to my son James Stafford my nego fellow Charles I
purchased John S. Collins to him his Heirs and assigns forever.
