Item I send unto my beloved wife Mary Kinney one Negro boy named Jack & one negro woman named Celia during her natural life, also one mare called a stanc also two cows & calves, also two sows & pigs, also two feather beds & furniture & one set of curtains also two pots and one Tea Kettle also one dutch Oven & one pair of fire dogs & shord & Tongz also one spider & Skillet also one bofet & all the crockery ware about the house that I die possessed of & two Juggs, also one womans saddle and bridle & all the chains belonging to the Horse, also fifteen barrels of corn & all the pork that is salted away about the house, also all my peas & blade fodder also one cloth Loom & stays and Harness, & one wooling wheel & three pair of Birds & all my knives & forks, also two chasts & one Cherry table also two plows & one pair chain traces also one cart & whels, also all my books also two pot trammels & two hoes & two Axes, also one pair of Scywers & all my Flax & Cotton about the House, also two ewes & Lambs & three bolls, also three Pork Barrels & all my Baskets, also two Smoothing Irons, now if in case my Daughter Siddy, should marry before her mothers death it is my Will that all the property which I have above lent to her mother my beloved wife be equally divided between them two, & if my said Daughter Siddy live single till her mothers death it is my Will that all the above lent property be my said daughters Siddy's for her & her heirs forever.

Item I Will and bequeath unto my daughter Elleriam Five Dollars.

Item I Will & bequeath unto my grana Daughter Hepsy Hall Five Dollars, I also Will & and bequeath unto two grana children Stephen & Betsy Kinney Five Dollars.

Item I lend unto my daughter Elleriam aforesaid one negro girl named Esther during her natural life, & after her decease to her children, if in case the said negro girl should not be called for towards the payment of my debts, and the reason that I have not mentioned my land above is because I had rather it should be sold towards the payment there over.

of my debts than other property, & if my debts should be settled without
selling my land it is my will that my beloved wife aforesaid have
her dowry in my said land during her natural life, & after her death
I will the said land to my said daughter Siddy, to her & her heirs forever
& the residue & remaining part of my property not above willed & bequeathed
it is my desire should be sold for the purpose of the payment of my debts
& if any remains over the payment of my debts it is my will that the same
be sold & the money equally divided among all my heirs, & I do nominate
constitute & appoint my trusty friends Thomas Hall & Thomas Lee
executors with my aforesaid beloved wife Mary Kinsey Executrix to this my
last will & testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand &
affixed my seal this 15th day of January 1815.
