Item I lend unto my beloved wife Mary Kinsey one Negro boy, named Jack & one negro woman named Belia during her natural life, also one mare called stance also two cows & calves, also two sows & pigs, also two feather beds & furniture & one set of curtains also two pots and one Tea Kettle also one dutch Oven & one pair of fire dogs & shroud & Tongs also one spider & skillet also one box of fat & all the crockery ware about the house that I die possessed of & two Suggs, also one womans saddle and bridle & all the chairs belonging to the House, also fifteen barrels of corn & all the pork that is salted away about the house, also all my peas & blade fodder also one cloth Loom & slaps and Harnes, & one wooling wheel & three pair of cards & all my knives & forks, also two chests & one cherry table also two plows & one pair chain traces also one cart & wheels, also all my books also two pot trammels & two hoes & two axes, also one pair of Silvers & all my Flax & Cotton about the House, also two ewes & Lambs & three bells, also three Pork Bands & all my Baskets, also two Smoothing Iron, now if in case my Daughter Siddy, should marry before her mothers death it is my Will that all the property, which I have at ore lent to her mother my beloved wife be equally divided between them two, & if my said Daughter Siddy live single till her mothers death it is my Will that all the above lent property be my said daughters Siddy's for her & her heirs forever.

Item I Will and bequeath unto my daughter Meriam Five Dollars.

Item I Will & bequeath unto my grana Daughter Hepsy Hall Five Dollars, I also Will & and bequeath unto two grana Children Stephen & Betsey Kinsey Five Dollars.

Item I lend unto my daughter Meriam aforesaid one negro girl, nameda Esther during her natural life, & after her decease to her children, if in case the the said negro girl should not be called for towards the payment of my debts, and the reason that I have not mentioned my land above is because I had rather it should be sold towards the payment

of my debts than other property, & if my debts should be settled without
selling my land it is my will that my beloved wife aforesaid have
her dower in my said land during her natural life, & after her death
I will the said land to my said daughter Fiddy, to her & her heirs forever.
& the residue & remaining part of my property, not above willed & bequeathed
it is my desire should be sold for the purpose of the payment of my debts
& if any remains over the payment of my debts it is my will that the same
be sold & the money equally divided among all my heirs, & I do nominate
constitute & appoint my trusty friends Thomas Hall & Thomas Lee
Executors with my aforesaid beloved wife Mary Kinney Executrix to this my
last will & testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand &
affixed my seal this 15th day of January 1815.
