I John Brown of the State of North Carolina Jones County  
Town of Trenton being weak in body but of sound mind &  
memory do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament in  
manner & form following viz.

I leave all my Stock of what nature or kind soever together with  
my Negro Wench Hannah to be sold by my Executors as soon as  
convenient and the Money arising from such Sale or Sales together  
with what monies may be due my Estate I leave first to pay  
my just Debts and the remainder to be paid for the trust  
of I now live in, which when paid for I leave to my  
loving Wife Rebecca Brown together with all my Household  
& Kitchen furniture during her natural life, and to be equally  
divided between my two Daughters Sally & Polly Brown to  
them their Heirs and Assigns for ever and if there  
should not be enough said to pay the Debts & purchase the  
House & lot as aforesaid, then I in that case leave so much  
of my other personal Property to be sold for that purpose —  
I give and bequeath to my Son John Richard Brown  
one Horse Cart & Wagon to him his Heirs & Assigns for ever  
If there shall be any monies left after paying the Debts &  
making the Purchase aforesaid I leave it to be equally divided  
between my beloved Wife Rebecca Brown & my three children  
Sally, John R. & Polly Brown their Heirs & Assigns for ever —

I nominate constitute & appoint my friend Richard Reynard  
my Son John Richard Brown & Mrs. Wife Rebecca Brown  
Executors & Executrix of this my Last Will & Testament  
hereby revoking & making void all other Wills or Wills here-  
tofore by me made, ratifying & confirming this & no other  
to be my last Will & Testament

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand &  
affixed my Seal this 15<sup>th</sup> day of April one thousand  
Eight hundred (15<sup>th</sup> April 1805) & 24<sup>th</sup> Year of  
American Independence — John Brown Esq.

for & as his last Will & Testament

I John Standland of the County of Jones State of North Carolina  
(planter) being imperfect of sound mind & memory thanks  
be given unto God calling unto mind the mortality of my body &  
knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make &  
ordain this my last Will & Testament, that is to say principal  
first of all, give & renounce my soul into the hands of Almighty God  
that gave it, my body I recommend to the Earth to be  
buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors  
nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive  
the same again by the mighty power of God, & as touching such  
worldly Estate wherewithal it has pleased God to bless me in this  
life, I give, dispose of the same in the following manner & form

Item I send my beloved Wife Hannah Standland living or deceased  
all the land wherein I now dwell, one Horse, Hogs & Cattle except  
one Herd of two Beeves I furniture & all the plantation tools &  
Utensils thereunto belonging, & House & Kitchen furniture

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Daniel Standland & all my  
land & plantation wherein I now dwell, one Horse & the like  
rewards, & also much where my son Daniel Standland arrives  
to the age of twenty one, then I want all the land property to be  
equally divided between my Wife & Children, I also leave Sixty  
five pounds to pay my debts due from spinning & right, to them  
their Heirs & Assigns for ever — And do hereby ratify  
disannul & set away other Testaments Will & Wills heretofore by  
me made, I do ratify & confirm this no other to be my last Will &  
Testament — And lastly I do nominate & appoint my  
beloved Wife Hannah Standland my whole sole Executrix of  
this my last Will & Testament — In witness whereof  
have hereunto set my hand & affixed my Seal this 15<sup>th</sup> day of October  
in the year of our Lord 1804 — Signed, sealed, published &  
witnessed & declared by the said John Standland at his last Will &  
Testament in the presence of us, who in his presence in the pres-  
ence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names
