stocks of her. I also bind my wife one man called Blaze
during her life but the executors of said man I bind
to her during only her widowhood and then to return to
my heirs as long after directed. Item I give the my son John
Jarmen Five pounds and no more having given already what
I intended for him Item I give and bequeath to my daughter
Anne Standly One pound and no more having already
given her what I intended for her Item I give to my
son Emanuel Thirty pounds and no more having therfore given
him nothing but some of what I intended for him —

Item I give to my son James Five pounds together with
what I have ~~planted~~ given him by such of gift Item I
give to my son John Jarmen all my lands I bought
of John Wimark Red fields and Tapifer Samuels (not
planted or otherwise disposed of) also my lands

 Condition give to my said son Ward, at the death of my
 Wife Three Negroes London Lucy and Arie to him and

 the condition above alluded to of the gift of those three Negroes
 London Lucy and Arie is that he my said son Ward and
 his mother to gether raise and support my younger Children
 free and clear of any charge whatever until they come of
 age or marries If they should neglect to comply with this
 condition then the three said Negroes are to be sold for
 the expenses of raising and supporting my said younger
 children — I also give to my son Ward the Stock after the death
 of my Wife to him his heirs and assigns forever —

Item I give to my daughter Betsey one Bed and furniture to
her her two and a half years for ever Item I give to my daughter
Rachel one Bed and Furniture Three Cows and Cales to her
her two and a half years for ever Item I give two hogsheads to
my daughter Nancy One Bed and furniture, and three Cows and Cales
to her her two and a half years for ever Item I give to Hark Bag all my
Ducks on Jones Branch and Duckahorn Creek also the Barn Cattishis
to him his heirs forever Item my Will is that the ~~old~~ named
Negroes to wife & sons called little Jim, Hamnah, Isaac Stephen
Moses Elmore be divided by lotting equally among my
three ~~orphanted~~ daughters Betsy Rachel and Nancy which
said Negroes I give to them and their heirs forever

Item My Will is further is that a negro man named
Solomon and a negro woman named Rose with them
increase be sold together with such other of my stock
and Household Furniture (not otherwise disposed of) which
may be most conveniently spared at the direction of my Executors
and out of the money arising therefrom all my just debts
should be paid also all the legacies herein named and
made the remainder together with the increase of the
Negroes I leave to my wife with all the monies due me
I desire to be equally divided amongst my four sons
