I Joseph Key of the County of Jones & State of North Carolina, considering the uncertainty of human life at birth do while in a firm State of mind and sound recollection make & ordain my last Will & Testament as follows. I lend unto my wife Ann Key during her natural life - the Land and Premises whereon I now live that I purchased of Sawkins Wilkerson, also Twenty acres of my old plantation, the west side of second branch, and all her demised said lands and all my better lands & Tenements I bequeath to my grand sons, Joseph Smith, Samuel Smith & Benjamin Smith, upon the following terms say as joint tenants not as tenants in common -

Item - I will to my said wife Ann the privilege of fuel, timber and necessary firewood during her life -

Item I bequeath to my said wife my Negro woman Bathsheba & her son Isaac also her son John Samell & my girl Emily heirs & assigns -

Item I lend to my daughter Pamel Keeto during her natural life & no longer either & will to be entirely under my said daughter's control & management during said term & not subject to the disposal or conveyance of any husband or husbands that she may have hereafter and after her death my said daughter to descend to her child by her second marriage the only child now living of Mr. Samuel Keeto, the other of her & issue to divide in equal dividends to her first set of children by the late Colib Smith upon except my grand daughter Nancy Smith who will have no part of this dividend -

Item. Residue of my Negro slaves not yet disposed of I will & bequeath to my said grand sons, Joseph Smith, Samuel Smith, Benjamin Smith & their two sisters Mary Smith once Eliza Smith in equal dividends as they may arrive of full age as joint tenants not as tenants in common - until they arrive of full age to be disposed of & hereafter by my Executors in any way that may seem most advantageous to said grand children and interest & income to be equally & fairly divided among them during or survivors heirs and assigns -

Item the residue of my estate real & personal, my stock, farming utensils, furniture, household & kitchen & all other things ^{that belong} to me, I authorize my executors to sell on a credit of six months proceeds of sale after deducting necessary charges to be divided as follows, say one third to my wife, one third part to my daughter (for money at her sole disposal & no other person) one other third to my five grand children, Joseph Smith, Samuel Smith, Benjamin Smith, their sisters Mary Smith and Eliza Smith survivors or survivors heirs & assigns for ever -

Last of all I constitute in a appoint my friends, James Roberts, Daniel Smith and Jacob Smith Executors of this my will, discharging & revoking all others heretofore made by me - In testimony whereof I have signed this my last will & testament of personal here to this instrument at my hand, presence & death this 9th day of January 1828.

Item. I give & bequeath to my grand son Curtis Westbrooke fifteen dollars —
Item. I give to my daughter Kelley Summers Twenty five Cents & no more —
Item. I give to my daughter Elizabeth Westbrooke Twenty five Cents & no more —
Item. I give my daughter Mary Westbrooke Twenty five Cents & no more —
Item I give & bequeath to my son Bryan Westbrooke all my household & kitchen
furniture with all my stock of Horses, Cattle, Hogs & Sheep & my farming utensils
And I hereby make & ordain my son Bryan Westbrooke Executor of this my last
will & Testament, in witness whereof I the said James Westbrooke have to this my
last will & Testament set my hand & seal the day & year above written —
