ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following

Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Catherine all the Land lying on the  
North side of Connors Branch during her life or widowhood also a negro  
girl named Celia during her natural life also one Son of mine Two  
Beds and Furniture Two Cows and Calves Thirty head of Hogs and all  
the Plantation Tools.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Edward One Hundred Acres of Land  
lying on Little Chinquapin, also the land lying on the South side of Connors  
Branch, also the Land left to my wife at her death, to my son Edward  
to him and his Heirs forever. Also one Horse and colt the horse named  
Arel and colt Shandy also One Saddle and Bridle One Yoke of Oxen  
One Cow and Calf. Three and Twenty head of Hogs running on Little  
Chinquapin

Item I give and bequeath to my son William One Negro fellow named Sam  
to him and his Heirs forever also one Horse Saddle and Bridle at his  
arrival of age. Provided my son William should die before he arrives at the  
age of Twenty One or has an heir lawfully begotten of his body the  
said Negro Sam is then to go my son Edward to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughters Nancy and Polly the above mentioned  
negro girl named Celia and her increase to be equally divided between them  
and their Heirs forever after my Wifes decease.

I also give to my daughters Nancy and Polly One Bed and Furniture to each  
of them also Two Cows and Calves, to each of them also I give to my daughter  
Polly one Hunting Saddle.

My further Will and desire is after all my just debts being paid all  
my property not before devised be equally divided between my three  
youngest Children.

And lastly I do appoint and ordain my Trusty friends Richard Koonce  
and John Westbrook Executors to this my last Will and Testament

God for the same do this thirteenth day of September in the year of our  
Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirteen make and ordain  
this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following That  
is to say

Imprimis. I lend to my beloved wife Susannah Becton the use and benefit of  
the Lands and Plantation whereon I now live, purchased of the Heirs and Repre-  
sentatives of Clement Richard dec<sup>d</sup> except the Lot at C. 6. known by the name  
Rice Field and one half of Lot at C. 1. One Dutch Fan one Cotton Gin the use  
and labour of five negroes namely old Daniel Dinah Thamer Charles and old  
Sarah, to her during her widowhood and no longer also I lend to my beloved wife  
Susannah the use and labour of two of the negroes herein after to be given to  
my daughter Elizabeth and son Simon S. Becton her choice from each of  
their lots during her widowhood or until they arrive of age or marry and no  
longer.
