

Codicil

I hereby revoke all that part of the foregoing Will which relates to Eliza F. Jones, now Eliza F. Stanley, and in lieu thereof, having no confidence whatever in her present husband Eliza Stanley. I hereby give and bequeath unto my son Autus Williams one negro woman named Patsey, also at the death of my wife one third part of all my negroes. Not otherwise disposed of together with one third part of all my other furnishable property, of every description in special trust however that he will hold the same for the sole and separate use and benefit of her the said Eliza F. Stanley for and during her natural life in such manner that the same shall be in no wise subject to the control or liable for the debts or contracts of her husband the said Eliza Stanley and I wish Charles or his executors, administrators or assigns to pay over to her the said Eliza F. Stanley the annual profits thereof for her separate use and benefit and at her death to surrender the absolute property thereto to her children.

I Hisiah Mallard of Jones County and State of North Carolina being sick of body but of perfect mind and disposing memory, calling to mind the mortality of the body & that it is appointed for all human beings once to die, do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament in manner and form following. In witness first of all I would recommend my soul to Almighty God that gave it, and my body to the Earth from whence it was taken, to be buried in a decent Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named, and as for such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bless me with I give devise and bequeath as follows viz:

First My will and desire is that all my just debts (should there be any) be first discharged, paid, with all funeral expenses

Item 2nd I give devise and bequeath unto Daniel Harrison son of William Harrison, one piece of land Beginning at a Hickory Daniel Mallards corner on the west side of Pumping run just within Daniel Harrisons field on the hill, and thence with the patient line to said Pumping run branch, thence up said branch to the mouth of a small branch next to the lands of D. Harrison thence up said small branch up to a Black Gum corner of the patient (said patient herein named was granted to Daniel Mallard) thence with said patient line to a Dogwood, another corner of said patient, thence to the beginning, containing by estimation eight acres more or less unto him the said Daniel Harrison his heirs and assigns forever

Item 3rd I give devise and bequeath unto my niece Mary Harrison daughter of Stephen Harrison and all the rest and residue of my estate real and personal of whatsoever kind it may be unto him for his heirs and assigns forever

Item 4th I hereby exclude all other relation from sharing any part or portion of my little estate they being hitherto provided for and having no just claim on my estate

Finally I nominate constitute and appoint my niece Mary Harrison daughter of Stephen Harrison above named and sole Executrix to this my last Will & Testament making all former ones of my hitherto made acknowledgeing this to be my only and last Will. In testimony

being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do
make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner of form as follows
In witness That my Executors hereinafter mentioned shall provide for my body a decent and Christian
like burial and settle the wishes of my relatives and friends and for all funeral and interment
expenses together with my just debts however and to whomsoever owing out of any other just
monies that may come into their hands as a trust and parcel of my estate
Item I give and devise unto my beloved wife Susan Kinney one third part of my house and her children
and family that remain with her at my decease I also give to my beloved wife One Bed Brattice
and necessary furniture to her her heirs and assigns forever Also I leave to my beloved wife Susan
Kinney during her natural life the following property to wit One Negro man Clegg One Negro man
Niles One Negro man Peter and his wife Anna One Negro woman Hannah and her young Child together
with her future increase Also Negro woman Little and all of her children not having other devise together with
her future increase Also two Mules her choice One Black Mare One Gelding One Cow and Calves
Three Sheep and Lambs Twenty five Hogs Two hams of Bacon and all of my Bed Bedding and furniture
and of the same to give One Bed and furniture to each Child as they may become of age or leave her together
with all my Household and Kitchen furniture I also leave unto my beloved wife Susan during her lifetime
one third part of my cleared lands known as my main plantation where I formerly resided which there
part is to include the dwelling house and the improvements with the privilege of Five acres and said timber
and other lumber for the use and repairs of the plantation said lot of land to begin at an Ash tree running
with the Jordham line to Kent River then down said Kent River with King's Creek joining theron to
Saskes Creek then at the various courses of the Creek to the beginning Also fifteen acres of land lying
between the Jordham line and Saskes Creek near the foot of Big Bend from nearly North of the place
mentioned piece containing the same containing twenty eight acres and the said one third part of
said land or share of my beloved wife to go to my son Jackson A. Kinney at her death
Item I give and bequeath unto my son Jackson A. Kinney the above described lands subject to the by birth of
his mother Susan Kinney Beginning at a Locust Tree in the run of Saskes Creek near an old pasture
and runs so 76° N 92° E poles to a Stake on the West side of the ditch bank Then so 25° E 52° poles then
so 10° E 22° poles to a small Post Oak on the ditch bank then so 22° N 26° poles to a Pine on the East side
of Long Branch then so 22° N 29° poles to the ditch then with the ditch so 3° N 34° poles then N 22° E
W 13° poles then so 10° E 28° poles with the ditch to the left then a Post Oak 31° poles to a small tree then
so 16° E 11° poles to the back line then with the back line a James S. Kinney line to the Jordham line then
with the Jordham line to the Ash tree with the various courses of the Creek to the beginning Also the
following named negro slaves viz Negro man Stephen and negro girl Anna and her two children living at the
time together with her future increase subject however to the following incumbrances that he pay to his
heir Joseph A. Kinney at my death the sum of Five hundred Dollars to him his heirs and assigns forever
