

In the name of God Amen.

I left Outbooks of the County of Jones and State of North Carolina severally considering the uncertainty of life and mindful of the obligation upon every man to have his affairs in order to make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following viz.

Imperium. It is my desire that my Executor hereon after named should liquidate and pay all my just debts.

Item. I lend to my beloved wife Alcy during her natural life for her own separate use and benefit subject to the control for said purpose of the Trustee hereinafter appointed, the following named property viz. The plantation wherein I now live containing One hundred and fifty five acres more or less, together with the improvements thereon, except two acres with the improvements thereto herein after described: The following named negroes to wit. Hepsy, Jim, Cinda Gaster, Mairida, Washl. Amanda, and West. All my Stock of every description and all the Household and Kitchen furniture and farming tools I may own at my death.

Item. I lend to my daughter Louisa Odum two acres land with the improvements thereon, being a part of the plantation wherein I now live which is excepted in the item of law to my wife, also the following named negroes, to wit. Alcy and her chd. Dusck, during the natural life of my wife Alcy, for her own separate use and benefit subject to the control for said purpose of the Trustee herein after appointed.

Item. I lend to my daughter Rachel Embank during her natural life for her own separate use and benefit subject to the control for said purpose of the Trustee herein after appointed, a piece of land containing seventy five acres more or less lying on the North side of Bear Branch and joining my plantation called the "Wharton place," and after the death of my said daughter Rachel Embank I give the said piece of land containing seventy five acres more or less to be equally and fairly divided among the children of my said daughter to them their heirs and assigns forever.

Item. After the death of my wife Alcy I lend to my daughter Louisa during her natural life for her own separate use and benefit subject to the control for said purpose of the Trustee herein after named, the plantation wherein I now live containing one hundred and fifty five acres more or less and after the death of my said daughter Louisa Odum I give the said plantation to be equally and fairly divided among the children of my said daughter to them their heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I lend to my son Alfred Embank during his natural life for his own separate use and benefit subject to the control for said purpose of the Trustee herein after named, the plantation wherein my said son now lives called the "Wharton place" containing two hundred and sixty eight acres exclusive of a piece of land growing thence lying on the North side of Bear Branch containing thirty five acres more or less herein before described of, and after the death of my said son Alfred Embank I give the said plantation to be equally and fairly divided among the children of my said son to them their heirs and assigns forever.

Item. After the death of my wife Alcy I give the above named negroes loaned to her during her natural life together with their increase, also the above named negroes loaned to my daughter Louisa Odum during her natural life together with their increase, to be equally and fairly divided among my three Chil. son Rachel Embank, Louisa Odum and Alfred Embank to them their heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I nominate and appoint my friend John A. Bender Executor to this my last Will and Testament; also nominate and appoint my said friend John A. Bender Trustee in the case above named of my wife Alcy and my three children Rachel Embank, Louisa Odum, and Alfred Embank.

The testimony of all which I have unto set my hand and seal the 7<sup>th</sup> day of December AD. 1852

State of North Carolina, Jones County February 12<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1853 I doth subscribe to this day make  
the following provision as a Codicil to my last Will and Testament above written and executed by me to wit.  
I wish and it is my will that my Executor and Trustee named in my said last Will and Testament  
should receive a fair compensation for his services as Executor and Trustee aforesaid, and as I have left  
no property to be sold and the rents and heirs if any will be but a small amount: Therefore my  
will is that in the event that I should not at my death leave money or debts due me sufficient to  
pay what debts I may owe at my death my burial expenses and a fair compensation to my Execu-  
tor and the Trustee as named in my will for his services as such that my Executor should sell a suffi-  
cient quantity of the Stock of Horses, cattle and Dogs or a portion of each that I may leave on hand at my  
death to pay the amount necessary for said purpose. The amount to be allowed to my said Executor  
and Trustee named to be fixed by the County Court of Jones County on application for the same by  
my said Executor and Trustee named in my said will. The testimony whereof I do hereunto set
