I Marmaduke Cox of the County of Long & State of S.C.
being sick in body but of sound mind & memory
thanks be to God, calling to mind the mortality of my
Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once
to die do make & Ordain this my last Will & Testament
in manner & form following — that is to say —
First of all I give & bequeath my Soul in to the hands of
Almighty God that gave it me & my Body to be buried
after a decent Christian manner nothing doubting but
shall revive the same again through the mighty power of
God and as touching such worldly goods as it hath pleased
God to bless me with I give & bequeath the same in man-
ner & form following —

First of all I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife
Mary Cox one Bed & Bedstead & furniture one Saw & pig's
two Stacks of Oats & all my Crops consisting of Corn fodder
and potatoes and all my pork on the Hog, that I expect
to kill this season to her her heirs executors and assigns
for ever — I further give & bequeath unto my son the
Arnold Cox all my land that I did possess of
and one shot gun & ten pounds in money to him his
heirs executors and assigns for ever. — I further give &
bequeath unto my daughter Patsy Perry to her her
heirs executors and assigns for ever. My Will & desire
further is that after all my just debts are paid that the

remainder of my estate to be equally divided between my wife
and all my children —
And lastly I nominate & ordain constitute & appoint my
son William Arnold Cox & my friend Raro Perry Esq
to this my last will & Testament — In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 7th day of
November 1808 —
