 my son Paul Barry one Negro girl by the name of Tab and one Cow and
 half to him and his heirs and assigns for ever Then I give and bequeath
 to my two sons Mark Barry and Paul Barry one Negro woman named Luce
 and also all that I am possessed with such as all the best of my Property but
 what I have already with away is to be equally divided between them and
 their heirs and assigns for ever I also constitute and appoint Mark
 Barry and Paul Barry Executors of this my last will and testament Choosing
 all other and former wills written by me at any time before made and not
 recorded to be my last will and testament In witness hereof I have set my
 hand and affixed my seal this seventh day of November one thousand seven
 hundred & ninety six

 of sound and perfect memory being aged do this the 8 day of November
 in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety three
 make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner
 following that is to say

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife one Negro man named
 Nithia and one Negro woman named Clara during her widowhood
 or until the my Children comes of age I give unto my two
 sons Lewis Williams and Lot Williams the two following Negroes Abraham
 and Hannah to be equally divided when my eldest son arrives to the age of twenty
 one years to them and their heirs and assigns for ever
 Also I give unto my beloved wife Johana Williams the following household
 and dishes to her and her heirs for ever also five bushels of Corn for the support
 of the family to be much Barke as my coat & thanks sufficient for the
 use of the family also two beds and Furniture also all my pewter
 and Crockery ware and one pot and all my Copper ware also two
 flukes one bare plow & after a consideration the Negro Arthur I sell to
 my wife I give the S. Arthur unto her and her heirs for ever And the
 Negro John I belong to them also one Hen and two Hens also all my
 flock of Cows & also one Chest and one Case also two Dead Sticks
 and Cords and one Table four Chairs and two Hat Sticks and
 two Sides of Leather and one Dutch Oven one Pan and Skillet one
 Sifter and scorch one Loam and one one side Saddle and Bridle
 and one Cold riding Saddle and Bridle and two Blade Sticks and
 two round Sticks of Topp and two hair of Snases and powdering Tub
 all my Cotton and Flax And ten and two Spinning wheels and one
 Linen wheel and one pair of Cotton Cards the above articles I give
 to my wife to use and to her heirs and assigns for ever
 I also give and bequeath unto my young Negroes
 Sala articles I give unto my wife and her heirs for ever my Wife
 and I give is that all the remainder of my Property be sold and one hundred
 acres of Land being or situated in the State and the money arising from
 the same to be put to the use of paying my just Debts if any left the
 remainder to go to my two sons Lewis Williams and Lot Williams
 My will is that all the land on the North side of the branch to be divided and
 that my wife keep the part of the plantation I she do get if not she
 divide with the other part My will is that the worst land I
 left to my wife relate to my two sons Lewis and Lot with her increase
 after the time I left her for - And I hereby make and ordain my
 Brother John Williams and John Williams and David Williams my
 Executors of this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I the
 Said Chaplin Williams have to the my last will and Testament set my
 hand and seal this day and of year above written
