last Will & Testament in manner & form following (by).


Item 1<sup>o</sup>. I recommend my soul to almighty God who gave it me, and  
my body to be buried in a christian like manner, at the discretion of my  
executors —

Item 2<sup>o</sup>. I give a bequest unto my grand son Frederick Tonville (son  
of Thomas J. Tonville) one negro child named Anthony to him his heirs  
and appogees forever —

Item 3<sup>o</sup>. My will & desire is that after my just debts is paid, that  
the residue of my property be equally divided between my three children  
William C. Murphy, Merinda Murphy & Deborah Murphy, each one to  
receive their share, when arriving to mature age, to them their heirs and  
Appogees forever —

Item 4<sup>o</sup>. I nominate and appoint my friend Emanuel Garmon  
Executor to this my last Will & Testament revoking all former Wills.  
In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this  
the 8<sup>th</sup> of Jan'y. 1831.
