I Nancy Brown of the County of Jones and State of North Carolina, being sick in body but of sound mind and memory (bless'd God for his mercies) And knowing it is appointed to all flesh to die do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and Terms following. I commend my soul to God that gave it and my body to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner. And touching such earthly Estate as the blessed God to bless me with, I will and bequeath as follows.

Item 1st I give to my daughter Dorcas Right five Dollars in money to be paid at the expiration of six months.

Item 2nd I give to my son Jesse S Taylor Ten Dollars in money to be paid at the expiration of six months.

Item 3rd I give to my daughter Nancy Kinney One Saw and five two trap Candlesicks.

Item 4th I give to my son Isaac Brown my mare called hol, four cows and calves all my Stock of Sheep and Hogs (not herein named) and all my meat that is on hand. One bedstead Bed and furniture and a Map Table on folding Leaf Table and One Clock. And all other things in my Estate after paying my debts and expenses to be equally divided between my daughter Nancy Kinney and son Isaac Brown. And lastly I nominate and appoint my son Isaac Brown my sole Executor to this my last Will and Testament relaying this and no other. In testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal February 9th 1852.

And at the same time Isaac Brown the Executor therein named came into Court and qualified as such, and Letters testamentary issued to him.
