

In the Name of God Amen I Richard Harrison of the State of North Carolina and County of Jones being weak of body but of sound disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following Vizt,

First of all I recommend my Soul to Almighty God who gave it, and my body to the Earth, to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors. — And as touching such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bless me with I give and dispose of in the following manner: first it is my desire that all my just debts be paid —

Item I give and bequeath to Thomas and Daniel Harrison (sons of my brother William Harrison) my Land lying on the River and joining the Land of Edmund Hatch & Frederick Fiske to them and their heirs and assigns forever.

It is my Will and desire that the Lands I now live on with all the residue of my estate both Real and Personal which is not already bequeathed to be sold by my executors and the money distributed in the following —

Item I give and bequeath to my Sister Susannah Harrison One Hundred Dollars.

Item I give to my Brother William Harrison Twenty Dollars.

Item I give to my Brother John Harrison Twenty Dollars.

Item I give to my Sister Anna Andrew Twenty Dollars

And it is my Will and desire that after the above Legacies is paid as is above described that one half of the balance left shall be paid to my sister Susanah — and the other half to be equally given to William Harrison John Harrison Anna Andrew Levi Harrison Susana Harrison daughter of Prudence Harrison and Mariah Harrison —

Lastly I nominate and appoint my trusty friends John Harrison & Thomas Murphy Executors to this my last Will and Testament ratifying this and no other — In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 16th day of March 1819.
