Appointed for all Men apace to die do make and ordain
this my last Will and Testament in form as follows videlicet

Item 1st I recommend my soul to Almighty God who gave it me
and my body to be buried in a Christian like manner at
the discretion of my Executors.

Item 2nd Whereas my other heirs have been heretofore provided for I
give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah B. Town the sum of one
dollar and also unto the heirs of my Son James one dollar each
and also to my Grand Son Edmund Hatch one dollar.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my Grand Son Richard I
Hatch the Plantation and lands on White oak river known by the
name of the Traimie upper plantation and also the following
Negro's Simon and his wife Rachel and four Children Tom,
Harriet, Dick and Eveline. also one bed and furniture for the
same to go with four Horses and four Cows and Calves
which property my Executor is to deliver to my said Grand Son
at my death.

Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Nancy
Larouge one Negro Girl named Betty and her increase:
Item 5th I give Anna bequeath unto my Grand Son Richard T. Green
all the lands I bought of Michael Boone also all the lands and
plantation on which I now live to go with the following Negroes
my Arnold and Children Henry, Christopher Wright and Africa
Old Mifflin, Tom, Leah, Mary, George and Penny, Robbins Holland and
five Children Joshua, Sarah, Moses, Aaron and Amos, also Silvania
five Children Venus, Demos, Molly, Lot, and Elija and also all of my
Note Book accounts and all of my property which I have not heretofore
written away.

Item 6th And lastly I nominate and appoint and by these presents
do nominate and appoint my Grand Son Richard T. Green sole
Executor to this my last will and Testament revoking all former wills
heretofore made by me this the 25th March A.D. 1813

Item 4th I give unto my Sister Mary Stanley one dollar to her her heirs and assigns forever
Item 5th I give unto my Sister Mary Cox one dollar to her her heirs and assigns forever
Item 6th I give unto my Brother John S. Kooms all my Notes Money and Accounts and
every thing that is not named above after paying all my just debts to him his heirs
and assigns forever
and I hereby do nominate and appoint my Brother John S. Kooms Executor to this my
last will and Testament revoking all other former wills made by me when I have
set my hand and seal this day and Year above written
by the said Simon E. Kooms the
testator as his last will and Testament
