and State of North Carolina being weak in body but of sound mind and
Memory (Blessed be God) Do this twenty third day of April in the year
A. D. Our Lord Christ 1846 and constitute this my last will and testament
in manner and form following (Viz) -
I give and bequeath unto my dearly beloved wife Rachael McDaniel
two Negroes namely Lonon and Elie. I give her one horse named
David and two Scares and eight shotes one feather Bed and furniture
and three barrels of corn two barrels of pork & all my fodder on the
place up to the road and dish half dozen plates & half dozen knives & forks
and one set cups and saucers and all the lot man that I got by her
and all her chairs and one bridal and shadow one plough & show grass
on. I and two wedding axes and a No house, barn and calf to
her her heirs and assigns for ever. I give unto my daughter
Edney McDaniel two Negroes namely Lucy Lee Roe & Calvin to her her
heirs and assigns for ever but if my dearly beloved wife should have another
child by me that the four above named Negroes be equally divided
between them I have and share them alike to her or to them her or their heirs and
and assigns for ever and if she or they should die without lawful issue
of her or their body to return to my wife during her natural life and after
her death to return to my four sons John David Elijah and Benjamin
to be equally divided among them and to them their heirs & assigns
for ever. I give unto my son Buckner McDaniel all the debts
that I have to pay for him. I give unto my daughter Charlotte
Lavender all the notes that I hold against her sister or Lewis Lavender
I give I give unto and bequeath unto my son Wm. McDaniel.
And my two grand children Sarah Bush and Thomas Buresse
my Negro girl named Brier to be divided among them that is to
say my son William McDaniel to have one half and the other to
be equally divided between my two grand children to them their heirs
and assigns for ever. I give unto my son John McDaniel
say I have named Kate to have his heirs and assigns for ever.
I give unto my son David McDaniel one gray horse by the
name of Charles to have his heirs and assigns for ever.
I give unto my son John McDaniel one feather bed & furniture
to him his heirs and assigns for ever. I give unto
my son David McDaniel one feather Bed & furniture to
him his heirs & assigns for ever. I give and bequeath
unto my son John McDaniel the piece of land that I bought
of Christopher Shufmon and on other place beginning at the
end of the street which at My corner State and runs with the
Robert Welch twenty poles then a straight line to the last corner
of the Shufmon land in the Middle line with the Shufmon
line to the stream of the big branch then down then down

In a stream of the big Branch to the Hudson line then with the husband-
 him to the River to him his heirs and assigns for ever —
 And if he should die without lawful issue to return to
 his three foster Sons David Elijah Benjamin to them their heirs
 & assigns for ever, Then I give all the Remainder of my
 to my three Sons David Elijah and Benjamin the Daniel
 to equally divide amongst them when the Youngest arrives
 to the age of twenty one and the profits arising from the
 land to go to the heirs I have left to them to them their
 heirs and assigns for ever and if any one of them should
 die without lawful issue to return to the other two —
 Then I give by bequest unto my four Sons John David
 Elijah and Benjamin three Negroes namely Samson
 Mary & Anaka to be equally divided amongst them
 when my Youngest Son arrives to the age of twenty one years
 to them their heirs and assigns for ever, And if either of them
 should die without lawful issue for the return to the
 surviving one or them I give all the remainder of my
 property to that same sort Nature or kind it may be to be sold
 by my Executors and after paying my just debts the Residue
 to be equally divided between my Son Mr. McDaniel & Charlotte
 Ponder. Then I give unto my Dearly beloved Wife Rachel
 the Daniel one Old Negro Wench Nancy. Then I give by
 demise Carthage and apprais my Grand Emanuel Jackson
 Francis Dabab McBrown Executors to the my last will and
 testament where by nothing & disavowing all other wills
 heretofore by me made in Testimony Here of I have Hereunto set
 my hand and Seal in the presence of
 Joseph M. Purson }

 one pig one bay horse one cow and calf her choice four
 half dozen earthen plates one set of knives and forks

one Mollen wheel and loads one Lunning Wheel to her her Slaves and Spigons for 89
wer — I then I bind unto my dearly beloved Wife Mary An a part of my lands
that is to say Beginning at the mouth of Backoon branch and with the ditch
to the bend of the ditch and then with the Course of the said branch to another
ditch then up that ditch to a Little pond then with the ditch to the head of said
ditch then with a good old ditch to the fence then with that fence until
strikes my house field fence then with that down to the beginning to her
during her natural life or Widowhood — I then I give and bequeath
unto Sun Christopher McDaniels All my my lands to him his heirs and
Spigons for Ever — I then I give unto my dearly beloved Wife An two
Barrels of pork and six Barrels of Corn — I then I have all my Negroes
& all the remaining part of my stock and all the rest of my property whatsoever
not Nature or kind may be to be sold by my Executors and after
after paying all my just debts the residue if any I give to my Sun
Christopher to him his heirs and Spigons for Ever — I then I nominate
constitute & Appoint my friends Isaac Brown and Emanuel
Garmon Executors to this my Last will and Testament a Revoking
and Disannulling all other wills by me Mollen made In witness
I have hereunto set my hand and Seal in presence of

the plantation whereon I now reside during her life time or widow
hood and after her decease or Marriage to be left to my daughter
Nancy — I also leave to my said wife the following Negroes with
their increase during her life (Viz) Killa & Grace and after her
decease the above said Negroes with their increase to be equally
divided among my children I also give to my said wife
one horse her own choice out of the stock that may be left after
my decease and all the House hold and Kitchen furniture
of every description — Second I give bequeath to my
Sun Benjamin the plantation whereon I formerly resided
and the lands adjoining to the branch whereon Mr. Shively
formerly resided and one Negro Man ^{named} Nero the above said land
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
