mind and memory be it so as do this the 31st day of February in the Year of our Lord 1844
make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner following that is to say
Item 1st I give unto my Brother Amos S. Koomie my Negro Girl Hollum and her increase
to him his heirs and assigns forever also all he is due me
Item 2nd I give unto my Nephew Simon Everett Koomie my Negro boys to wit Arthur
and Charles to him his heirs and assigns forever
Item 3rd I give unto my Brother Michael Koomie one dollar to him his heirs and assigns forever
Item 4th I give unto my Sister Mary Hardy one dollar to her her heirs and assigns forever
Item 5th I give unto my Sister Mary Cox one dollar to her her heirs and assigns forever
Item 6th I give unto my Brother John S. Koomie all my Notes Money and Accounts and
every thing that is not named above after paying all my just debts to him his heirs
and assigns forever
And I hereby do nominate and appoint my Brother John S. Koomie Executor to this my
last will and Testament revoking all other former wills made by me when of sound
discreet mind and memory
by the said Simon E. Koomie the
Executor as his last will and Testament
