Chairs and as much Tan leather as will shoo the families
the first year I all the rest that is now in the Garance
and one weaving Loom Stays & Chittles and two hives
Bees and use of one negro named Sam till my son
Asa is ten years old then for Sam to be divide out
yearly to the highest bidder and the money so arising
shall be put out upon interest for my son Asa Edwards
till he is twenty one years old if my wife Sarah should
marry & move out of the County of Jones or barbancourt
in the aforesaid negroes or their monies I desire my
Executors to take them out of her possession.
Item I give unto my son Asa Edwards all my lands

and negro boy named Sam and one Ma, Cpt, and woman
and at the death of his mother I give to my son Asa all
the goods & chattels that I have left to my wife & break ex-
cept the negroes if my son Asa should die before he has
a lawful heir I desire for all my Lands this side of the
mountain to be sold and the money equally divided among
my children and the land I hold by entry over the mountain
I give to my Brother John Edwards of he never bring no
charge against my Estate for the ~~use~~ of his negroes with
me and if he does for the land to be sold for the use of my
children. Item I give to my Daughters Elizabeth Edwards
Virginia Edwards and Pruzan Edwards two negroes
named Sam and Bet and the increase of Bet at the
death of their mother to be equally divided amongst
them if my wife should die before Pruzan is fifteen years
old I desire for the negroes not to be divided till my
Daughter Pruzan Edwards is fifteen old I desire for
all the remainder part of my Estate to be sold that
have not been heretofore given nor left the money
so arising to be equally divided amongst my three
Daughters heretofore named, My wife Sarah shall
give all my children good learning an especially my
son Asa at her own expence or I desire for my Executors
to hire out Caesar and Bet and to give them good learning
and my son Asa bound to a merchant or some other good
trade I hereby make and appoint my loving friends John
Hill & Michael Roonee full & sole Executor to this my
last will and Testament & as hereby making, disown-
ing and making void all former wills & bequests by
