Will & Testament.

First I desire to be decently buried at the discretion of my execs
my Temporal estate I bequeath & dispose of in the following
manner

- 1st Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Rebekah one
Bed, one Mare Bridle & Saddle together with all the other
articles in her possession
- 2nd I give & bequeath unto my son Benmette Yeates all the Land
I bought of Benja. Hundine lying in Onslow County also all
the other articles now in his possession to him his Heirs & Assigns for ever
- 3rd I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth one Mare one Cow
& Calf together with all the other property now in her possession
- 4th I give & bequeath unto my Son Daniel Yeates the Land I now
live on after the death of my wife Alice Yeates one Cow & Calf
one Mare Bridle & Saddle one Bed & Furniture at his
coming to age or marry to him his Heirs & Assigns for ever
- The residue of my Estate I leave unto my Beloved wife
Alice Yeates during her life & Intervening unless my son
Daniel Yeates arrives to age or marry then for him to have
one third of the above the remaining two thirds at the death
of my wife Alice Yeates to be sold the Money arising to be
equally divided between my two Sons Benmette & Daniel
Yeates & my Daughter Rebekah Cularks and I do hereby
constitute & appoint my wife Alice Yeates my whole or
my son Benmette Yeates my whole Exec. to this my last
Will & Testament & I do hereby utterly revoke & annul &
disannull all former bequests, Wills & Legacies by me
heretofore in any wise left or made, declaring & certifying &
confirming this to be no other to be my last Will & Testament

I Elizabeth Smith of the County of Jones & State of North Carolina
of sound mind & memory do make, ordain, constitute this my last Will and
Testament, hereby revoking all others by me made, Touching my worldly
affairs after my Body is decently interred it is my Will & desire that my
Son James Smith should have all my Lands on White Oak whereto I
last lived & joining to Smith's Land, which said land I give & bequeath
unto my Son James Smith his Heirs & Assigns for ever

- 2d I give & bequeath to my two Sons Bazell & James Smith the Money due
me from Richard Nixon which is upwards of Forty Dollars, & my Mare
to be sold & the Money arising from the Sale of the Mare with that
due from Nixon to be put at Interest, & when my oldest Son Bazell
arrives to full Age to be equally divided between Bazell & James, & the
part allotted to James to be kept at Interest till he arrives to lawful
age, to them their & Assigns for ever
- 3d I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Eliza Smith all my property
of a Family of Negroes now in the possession of my Mother & to
be divided equally between her Children at her decease, unto my said
Daughter Eliza her Heirs & Assigns for ever
- 4th I also give & bequeath to my Daughter Eliza all my proper
tional part of my Husband's Estate which is yet undivided, one Bed
& Furniture, one Clothts Chest, one Tea Chest, half a Dozen Tea Spoons, &
one flat Spoon Silver, & One Saddle, to her & her Heirs & Assigns
for ever
- 5th And lastly I appoint & constitute my Brother R. Nixon
& my friend Josiah Howard my Executors to this my last Will
& Testament. In witness whereof I have set my
Hand & fix my Seal this 25th of March 1803 in presence
of the subscribing witnesses
