

In the name of God Amen.

I, Wealthy Bryan of the County of New Hanover and State of North Carolina, seriously considering the uncertainty of life and mindful of the obligation upon every person to leave their affairs in order do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, viz:

Impressus. I wish my Executors herein after named to liquidate and pay all my just debts and my funeral expenses from funds I may have on hand at my death or of none on hand from proceeds of sale herein directed to be made.

Item I give to my daughter Mary & Rhodes two Bedsteads and Furniture and one pair of Brass Audions to her her heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give to my daughter Julia W Hines one Mahogany Bedstead and one set Mattingay tables to her her heirs and assigns forever.

I leave my negro girl Betsy to my daughter Mary & Rhodes till the said Betsy is twenty one years old (she is now about seventeen years old) and should the said girl Betsy have a child before she is twenty one years old, I give the said child to my grand daughter Anna D. Rhodes to her, her heirs and assigns forever.

When my said negro girl Betsy is twenty one years old I wish her sold by my Executors either at public or private sale as they may deem best or most advantageous, for Cash, and I desire that she be purchased by one of my sons in law Christopher C Rhodes and Jesse D. Hines, if convenient, and that with the proceeds of the sale after deducting expenses and any amount I may owe and not otherwise provided for as above stated, that they purchase two negro girls to best advantage one of which negro girls I leave to my daughter Mary & Rhodes during her natural life and after her death I give the said negro girl together with her increase to be equally divided among the Children of my said daughter Mary & Rhodes to them their heirs and assigns forever.

The other negro girl so purchased as above directed I leave to my daughter Julia W Hines during her natural life and after her death I give the said negro girl together with her increase to be equally divided among the Children of my said daughter Julia W Hines to them their heirs and assigns forever.

I appoint my sons in law Christopher C Rhodes and Jesse D. Hines Executors to this my last Will and Testament but should either or both of my said sons in law die before me, then I appoint my daughter or daughters as the case may be Executrix or Executrices.
