Item, I give and Bequeath unto my son William Varmon all the Barnow land except a part that I have given to my Daughter Rachel to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item, I Give and Bequeath unto my two daughters, Penelope Varmon and Elizabeth Pickens, all my Smith place lands, to be equally divided between them to their heirs and assigns forever.

Item, I give unto my Daughter Penelope Varmon one Cow that I had of Braddy.

Item, I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Pickens One juda Cow.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my Grandson son Hebe Varmon, one Negro girl Eliza to him his heirs and assigns forever, and if he should die without lawful issue to Return to my family.

Item, I give and Bequeath unto my Grandson son Hardy McDaniel one Negro girl named Jane to him his heirs and assigns forever, and if he should die without lawful issue to Return to my family.
