I William Gooding of the County of Jones and State of North Carolina being of a sound mind and memory blessed be God do this the 12th day of September in the year of our Lord 1858 do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say that my Executors herein after named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of relations and friends and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts however and whencesoever owing out of the money that may first come into hands as a part or parcel of my Estate

Item 1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Council Gooding two negroes Lewis and Sarah, One bed and Furniture

2nd Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Ira Gooding two negroes, Anthony and Misura, One bed and Furniture

3rd Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Moses two negroes Andrew and Eliza Anna all the Land that I Bought of William Jordham and all that I Bought of Emanuel Roome and the Westbrook Lands and some that took up between Heritage Branch and the Maple Branch. One bed and Furniture and one Mare by the name of Pigeon

4th Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Son Isaac Gooding Three negroes Thence, Anna and hester and all my home plantation. One Bed and and Furniture and one Mare by the name of fly

5th Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Mary Gooding Two negroes Joseph and his Sister Mary, And Seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars. One Bed and Furniture and one Bett by the name of George

6th Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Grandson Jesse Westbrook Five Hundred Dollars and one Bett by the name of Bealem

7th Item I want the balance of the household and Kitchen Furniture and all the plantation tools, and all of my stock consisting of hogs Cattle and horses Sheep &c equally divided between my three Sons that they may not be sold at public sale, Council Gooding and Ira Gooding and Moses Gooding and Isaac Gooding

8th Item I want the balance of my Land and negroes that is not mentioned, sold on six months credit and the money arising after paying my just debts and what I have owing to me after giving off what I have mentioned to them the balance I want equally divided between my three Sons Council, Ira, Moses, and Isaac Gooding

9th Item I nominate and appoint and constitute my three Sons Council Gooding and Ira Gooding and Moses Gooding sole Executors to this my last Will and Testament I hereunto set my hand and seal this the day and date just above written Signed sealed, published and delivered by the said William Gooding the testator as his last will and testament in presence of us who was present at the time of Attaching and Delivering thereof

A paper writing purporting to be the last will and testament of William Gooding Decd is exhibited for probate in open Court by Moses Gooding one of the Executors therein named and it is therupon proved by the oath and examination of William G Jordham and Christopher Jordham that Isaac S Jordham one of the subscribing witnesses thereto is now dead. and it is further proved by the oath of said Wm G Jordham and Christopher that they are acquainted with the hand writing of the said Isaac S Jordham, having often seen him write and that the hand of said Isaac S Jordham subscribed as a witness to the said Will in the hand writing of the said Isaac S Jordham and the said execution of the said will

by the Said William Gooding is also proved by the oath and examination of William C. Forshaw
one of the subscribing witnesses thereto. It is therefore considered by the Court that the said paper
writing and copy part thereof is the last will and testament of the said William Gooding
and the same is ordered to be recorded and filed and thereupon the said Moses Gooding and
Ira Gooding executors aforesaid duly qualified as such by taking the oath required by law
Ordered that letters testamentary issue to them. At the same time Ira Gooding one of the
executors therein named comes into open Court and renounces his right to qualify as one of the
executors to said Will.

I make and publish this my will and Testament in manner and form following viz
The Estate of my Husband Nathan Rose deceased being undivided. I bequeath one seventh
part of the Negroes and moveable property of that Estate I give and bequeath to my son
Cyrus G. Rose Six hundred and forty dollars to him his heirs, assigns forever
I also give and bequeath to my son Edgar M. Rose Six hundred and forty dollars, to
him his heirs, assigns forever
I give to my Daughter Olivia S. Rose Six hundred and forty dollars to her, her heirs
assigns forever
I also give and bequeath to my son Josephus R. Rose One thousand and forty dollars
to him his heirs, assigns forever
And if the sum aforesaid by me is not sufficient to pay over as mentioned above My wish and
desire is that my Executor sells negroes to make up the deficiency
My wish and desire is that the remainder of the negroes to be equally divided among my
Children J. B. Toy, S. C. Rose, C. G. Rose, C. M. Rose, C. J. Rose, J. R. Rose & their
during their natural life and then to their children, if there be no children, to the
surviving Brothers and Sisters
And I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my son Cyrus G. Rose, Executor
for the purpose of carrying the foregoing into execution
