

In the Name of God Amen, I William Harrison of the County of Jones and State of North Carolina, Distant being in Perfect health and of sound mind and Memory. Thanks be given unto God, calling unto mind the Recalling of my Body, and knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to Die. Do make, and Ordain this my last Will and Testament, That it to say Principally and First of all, I give and renounce my Soul unto the hand of Almighty God that give it, and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be Buried in a Decent Christian Burial, at the Direction of my Executors nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection, I shall Revive the same again, by the mighty Power of God, And as Touching such worldly Estate wherewith it had pleased God to Bless me in this Life, I give Donor and dispose of the same in the following manner and Form.

**Item** I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Elizabeth Harrison One Negroe Woman named Felby One Negroe boy named Chalt, one Double Bedding Chair, Four Feather Beds and six new cover, One Chest One Dish One Table, And all the Remainder and Residue of my stock of Hogs and hogs of all kinds, after so much of the same, being sold by my Executors as will pay all my just Debts, To her and her heirs and assigns for ever, I give also Land unto my Beloved Wife Two Negroe men Named Abram and Columbus and Two Negroe Woman named Siddy and Judy, and All my stock of Horses and every other things belonging Except such articles that I shall mention and give hereafter in this my Will, During her my said Wifes Natural Life, To Enable her my said Wife to maintain my Children and Educate them, without any Charge against their Estate.

**Item** I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph Harrison, One hundred and Twenty Acres of Land joining the plantation whereon he now dwells Purchased of John Bryan also one Hundred Acres of Land Lying on the west side of the Lands whereon he now dwells To be begun and laid off, at a pine the Beginning of a Survey of Five Hundred and Thirty Three Acres patented in my own name, and Running on the first Corn of the said Survey up to the north prong of the Mill Swamp so as to complete the before mentioned One Hundred Acres of Land, and Two Negroe men named Arthur and Orris Two Negroe Boys named Isaac and George One Negroe Woman Named Ginny and her Three Children, and all and every other kind of Property that I have heretofore given to him by Deed or otherwise To him his heirs and assigns for ever.

**Item** I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Bryan, One Negroe Woman named Amy One Negroe woman named Aggy and her Child Named Lays and all and Every other Property that I have heretofore given to her To her and heirs and assigns for ever.

**Item** I give and bequeath unto my son Benjamin Harrison One hundred and Twenty five Acres of Land be the same more or less Lying on the North side Front River, beginning at a Red Oak at the bank of the River and Running as the Dividing now stands, To a Cherry Tree, then with a straight Line to the nearest part of Little Chinguin pin run then down the various courses of said run to the river Then up the various courses of the river to the First Station and also all the Land and plantation whereon he now dwells on the South side of said River with all the Land or Lands that I have heretofore Purchased thereto adjoining And Four Negroe men named Stephen, Isa, Jack and Sam, and one Negroe girl named Betty and all and every other kind of property, that I have heretofore given to him by Deed or otherwise, To him his heirs and assigns for ever.

**Item** I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Susanna Bryan, One Negroe man named Bob, and Two negroe boys named Will and Richmon, and all and every other kind of Property that I have heretofore given to her, To her and her heirs and assigns for ever.

**Item** I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Spright Two negroe girls named Bette and Dinah, and one Negroe boy named Tom, and all and every other kind of Property that I have heretofore given to her, To her and her heirs and assigns for ever.

**Item** I give and bequeath unto my Daughter, Rebecca Sales, Two negroe girls named Rose and Tabb, and a Negroe boy named Cesar and all and every other kind of Property that I have heretofore given to her, To her and her heirs and assigns for ever.

**Item** I give and bequeath unto my son Simmons Harrison the Land and Plantation whereon Isaac Dewell, Containing Three hundred acres of Land be the same more or less, Also One other Survey of One hundred Acres of Land joining the same patented in my own name Also Four hundred and Thirty Three acres of Land joining the same patented in my own name, And also Two hundred Acres of Land Lying on both sides of Front River that I purchased of Joseph Sack, also fifty Acres of Land joining the same that I purchased of Benjamin Whitech and also Two hundred and Thirty Two Acres of Land joining the same that I purchased of William Busack, Junr, and Five Negroe Boys named Jacob, Anthony, Emproi, Daniel, and Little, and one Negroe Girl named Lisa, One Negroe man named Charles and and his wife named Ginny, One Slave named Fonnix, One bed and Furniture One Chest one Cox and one yoke of Oxen and one horse named brandy and all and every other kind of property that I have heretofore given to him by Deed or otherwise, To him his heirs and assigns for ever.

**Item** I also give and bequeath unto my said son Simmons Harrison that part of my property that I have lent to my beloved Wife During her Natural Life Except such articles that I shall hereafter mention, And give otherwise in this my Will, To him his heirs and assigns for ever.

**Item** I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Dinah Harrison, One Negroe Woman named Eady and her Two Children named Hannah and Fells, Two Negroe boys named Grel and Charles one bed and Furniture One Chest and one Ox, four Cows and Calves and one horse saddle and bridle to be worth Thirty pounds, To her and her heirs and assigns for ever.

**Item** I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Charlotte Harrison, Two negroe Girls named Sucey, and Little Tilly, Two negroe boys named Jilt and Ned, One One negroe man named Ambers One bed and furniture One Chest one Ox, four Cows and Calves, And one horse saddle and bridle to be worth Thirty pounds To her and heirs and assigns for ever.

And I do hereby Revoke and Dissolve all and every other Testament, Will or Will heretofore by me made, and do Ratify and Confirm this and no other to be my last Will and Testament.

And Lastly, I do nominate and appoint my Beloved Sons Benjamin Harrison and Simmons Harrison, my sole and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

I Isaac Hathaway of the County of Jones and State of North Carolina being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament and do dispose of my worldly estate in the following manner Viz I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elanor the this Lot whereon my Dwelling House stands together with the House & Improvements and the lower Corner Lot adjoining the same to her her heirs and assigns forever I give devise and bequeath unto the child with which my loving wife is now pregnant my three other Lots in Trenton with their improvements to it and its heirs and assigns forever

My personal estate I leave first Subject to the payment of my Debts and what shall be remaining of what nature or kind I give to my beloved wife Elanor

Lastly I nominate and appoint my beloved wife Elanor Executrix and my Father in Law Abraham Belimons Executor to this my last Will & Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 22<sup>nd</sup> Day of October 1798

I Nathan Bryan of the County of Jones and State of North Carolina (being now in Scotland) being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner & to form following Viz

I recommend my soul to God who gave it and my body to the dust until the resurrection of the just when I hope to receive it again fashioned like unto Christ's glorious body no more to see Corruptions and as to my worldly goods I leave and dispose of in the following manner

I give to my Daughter Mary Broom all that I have put into her possession as her property, also one large Mahogany table which shall be considered as her full share of my Estate and my will is that my said Daughter Mary or any persons claiming by or under her shall not again come in or share any part of my Estate in consequence of any Deaths that may take place among any of my children after my decease or otherwise

I give to my son John Thomas Bryan Negroes seven or eight and four and three quarters of Corn & the potatoes at hobb's place and one feather bed and furniture (the bed & furniture is in his possession) to him his heirs and assigns forever

I give to my son Nathan Bryan a piece of Land including the plantation whereon Nancy Taylor formerly lived from Joseph Brooks line on the north and Richard Thom and Jones and John F. Bryans lines on the east and south and as far west as a due south line from an old dividing corner pine between Joseph Brooks and myself to the line from said pine to John F. Bryans line estimated at two hundred acres by the same more or less I also give to
