Impremises, It is my wish that all my just debts
be first paid - It is then my will & desire that
the remainder of my property be distributed in the
following manner, I lend to my mother
Lucas Miller of North Carolina aforesaid all the
profits arising from the labour of my negroes
Sarah & her two children George & Jim, and also
all the profits that may arise from the labour of
any children she may afterwards have during
her natural life at her death it is my Will and
desire that the above named bonds Sarah and
her two children George & Jim together with all
their full increase be equally divided between all
the children of my brother James Harrison share
and share alike to them & their heirs for ever -
Item, I give to my brother Abner Harrison one
Bed & furniture now in possession of my mother
Lucas Miller - all the remainder of my
property both in North Carolina & also at this time
in South Carolina, It is my Will & desire that
it be equally divided between all my brothers &
Sister to wit Wiley James, Mary & Abner - -
Lastly I constitute and appoint my dear & beloved
brother James Harrison my only Executor to this
my last Will & Testament - In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal this Twenty
fifth day of May one thousand eight hundred
and twelve and in the thirty sixth year of the
Independence of the united States of America

 I 2^d Gilett of Jones County am very sick in body but
 of sound mind & memory but being mindfully of
 modesty and the care of my family I make this my last
 Will and Testament Revolving all other Wills written by me
 before - First of all I recommend my soul to God that gave
 it thanks be to God for the same and my body to be
 buried at the direction of my Wife & Executors - and as
 for such worldly goods as God hath been pleased to bestow
 with I dispose of the same as follows -
 First of all I desire that all my just debts shall be paid
 also I lend to my well beloved wife Rachel Gilett during
 her life all my land and at her death if Thomas Gilett
 should be alive I give & bequeath all the same I now
 own to him & his heirs and assigns for ever - and if the
 said Thomas Gilett should not be alive at the death
 of my Wife Rachel Gilett my will & desire is that the
 above mentioned land should be divided among my
 sisters children - also I give and bequeath to my
 well beloved wife Rachel Gilett one negro man by
 the name of Moses and also one third of Pleasant and
 one third of Dennis to her and her heirs and assigns
 for ever - Item I lend unto my wife Rachel Gilett
 during the term of her natural life & no longer negroes
 Joel & Andrew and after her death the same to be equally
 divided between my brother Thomas Gilett and the children
 of sister Betsy Gilett, Polly Ramsey & Abby Morris to
 share & share alike, then their heirs and assigns
 for ever - Item I give unto my said wife one
 horse Saddle for cows & three calves, one yoke of Oxen
 three feather beds & furniture Two Sows & twenty
 shoats, four hives of bees & woman saddle, one riding
 Chair & harness three tables & one Desk six Chairs one
 Spoon one tea kettle two Pots one spider one trammel
 upon five dogs & span tong & a fire shovel her her
 heirs and assigns for ever -
 Item the residue of my estate real & personal not
 before disposed of I authorize my Executors to sell
 on a credit of six months the proceeds thereof after
 deducting my pay any charges payment of my debts or
 the same for the said Executors to my wife Rachel
 Gilett her her heirs and assigns for ever -
 Last of all I constitute and appoint my wife Rachel
 Gilett & Samuel Davis Executors of this my will
 revoking all others by me made - In Witness whereof
 I this day set my hand & seal the 15th day of
 May 1812 -
