

In the name of God Amen -

I William Harrison senior of the County of Jones & State of North Carolina being very weak of body but of sound & perfect mind and memory and calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do constitute Princepsally & first of all I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it and my body recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors after named, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again, by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly goods as it has pleased Almighty God to bless me in this life, I give and dispose of in manner & form as following, that is to say - My will & desire is that my just debts & funeral charges be paid by my Executors

Item - I give to my son James Harrison one hundred acres of land on the North side of Weeps Creek, beginning on the river at the mouth of the branch called the River potok then up the said branch with the edge of said branch to the cut line of the land that I bought of Levi Harrison, then with the said line to John Mullards line, then with the dividing line between me and John Mullard to jumping run, then in the said run to the beginning, and I give him one feather bed & furnished to him his heirs & assigns for ever -

Item - I give to my daughter Mary Harrison one feather bed & furniture & one chest, to her and her heirs and assigns for ever -

Item - I give to my son Thomas Harrison one feather bed & furniture and one tract or parcel of land, called one hundred & eighty acres contained in a deed from Gushorn Wood and another from James Thoms Shiff. after the expiration of my wifes widowhood, to him his heirs and assigns for ever -

Item - I give to my son Daniel Harrison one feather bed & furniture and one hundred acres of land containing all the remaining part of my plantation & land on jumping run held in the same deeds with that given to my eldest son James Harrison after the expiration of my wifes widowhood to him his heirs and assigns for ever -

I leave to my wife or child in each plantation & land which I have given to my sons as long as she lives a widow and no longer, and the remaining part of my property not mentioned I leave at the discretion of my Executors after named and in their care till my youngest son is twenty one, then I give my dwelling house to my wife & daughter to my wife as long as she lives a widow, and to my daughter as long as she lives a single woman, and one feather bed & furniture and my best horse or mare, and the remainder part of my personal property not mentioned, I give one half to my wife & daughter to them their heirs for ever - and the rest to be equally divided between my three sons James, Thomas & Daniel, And I do nominate & appoint my wife Mary Harrison and my son James Harrison & my son Thomas Harrison Executors to this my last will and testament -
