Whitebacked & give to my Nephew Charity Meade one cow called
Snow — I give to my Nephew Israel Collins one Three year old White
Horse, & give to my Sister Sophia West three Gowns, one
Striped Bonnet, one yellow flower'd Bonnet, one striped Home
spun one Coat pattern — Also, I give to my Nephew
Nancy Meade one Gown red flower'd Bonnet
Also, I give to my Nephew Polly Collins one White Muslin
Gown, and my Nephew Barbara Collins one Red Cloak,
and all the remainder part of my Estate that is not mentioned
made to be equally divided between my Two Sisters Barbara
Meade & Hannah Collins — Also I constituted
myself John Collins & my Nephew Ben. Collins & Barbara
Collins my whole body Executors of this my last Will &

& Forty four Acres of Land at my Death, also that other hundred
& Forty four Acres at my Wife's Death or Marriage, to her & her
Heirs & Assigns for ever — Item, I give unto my Wife's Daughter Ann Murphy One
Tea Caddy, Bed & Furniture & One Horse Earling, & One Sow & Pig
to her Heirs or Assigns for ever — Item, the half of my Estates sent to my Wife, I leave to be sold
at my Wife's Death or Marriage & the Money to be equally di-
vided the Children of Sarah Williams, & William Herbert likewise
first paying all my just Debts — Item, I hereby nominate & appoint my beloved
Wife Priscilla Herbert, & Benjamin Williams Executors of this my last
Will & Testament whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this
Year first above written & published by the William Herbert

& one Shovel Plow, Four Hoes & Two Axes, Two washing Tubs
& Two Pails, also all my Geese, my Hand Mill, Two Sheep
Lambs, one Calf & Bottleg, also one fine Saddle & Bridle,
to them & their Heirs & Assigns for ever.
Item, I give & bequeath to my Son Daniel Connor One
Horse called Diamond to him & his Heirs & Assigns for ever.
Item, I give & bequeath to my Son James Connor One
Horse called Freedom, to him & his Heirs & Assigns for ever.
Item, I know all the Residue of my Estate not herein
named to be equally divided amongst all my children
except my aforesaid mention'd John Connor, also Connor Silas
Connor & David Connor to them & their Heirs & Assigns for ever.
Also I highly make Ordain my Wife Rebekah Connor
Executive, & my Son Edward Connor Executor to this my

Tools of ~~any~~ kind whatsoever, Two Yoke of Oxen, all my
Stocks of cattle, Hogs & Sheep, & all my Crop of corn
kind standing on the Plantation or houses, until my
youngest Child shall arrive of Age, or Day of marriage,

Also it is my Will & desire that my said Wife Mary
Becton shall have the Use & Labour of each of my Children's Legacies
hereafter given until as they arrive to Lawful Age or day of Mar-
riage. — Also it is my Will that my said Wife Mary Becton
shall maintain & give all my Children good Education; also pay
to my Son in Law Benjamin Lammour the sum of five pounds
Quarterly Money in full of his Part of my Estate, besides what
I have heretofore given him, which will be hereafter devis'd to
him by this my Will. And also that my said Wife is to pay &
discharge all my just Debts without any Cost, Charge or Demand
against any of my Children or their Estates.

Item. I give, devise & bequeath to my Son in Law Benjamin
Lammour Five Pounds current Money to be paid to him by my
Will as aforesaid in full of his part of my Estate besides what
I have heretofore given him, to him, his Heirs & Assigns.
