

In the Name of God Amen —

I Williams John of the County of Jones and the State of State Carolina

(Planter) being of sound mind and memory and in a common health thanks be to god for the same do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament, In manner and form following that is to say —

1<sup>st</sup> I give unto my wife beloved wife Ann John five negro names, John, Sam, and two other names names Mingo, Anna, Morning, also three head of horses her choice out of my stock of horses — six Cows & Calves, three others from them and two year olds one year old of both and one calf eight hogs and as many dry hogs as will be sufficient for her meat one year, Twenty head of sheep her choice three bar' ploughs three pair of teams, the set of plowshares, four club axes, four heading hoes three grubbing hoes, and as much Cotton and wool as will be sufficient for family — year. Also one set Cookers tools and Carpenters tools, also one years provision sufficient for her family one year — also the increase of the above named negroes to her and her heirs and assigns for ever —

2<sup>nd</sup> I leave to my beloved wife Ann John the sum of my — wherein I now live with all the provideds thereunto belonging so long as she remains my widow and no longer —

3<sup>rd</sup> I leave unto my beloved wife Ann John five negro names John, Sam, Sealah, and Dack, with all my household & kitchen furniture of my name and only such as I shall hereafter give away, to her proper use and benefit during her natural life and after her death to be equally divided between my four youngest children —

4<sup>th</sup> I give unto my beloved wife Ann John one grana stone and hand mill, and also of my Pottery of every kind whatsoever for ever —

5<sup>th</sup> I give unto my beloved son Simmons John five dollars with all that I have heretofore given him to him his heirs and assigns for ever —

6<sup>th</sup> I give unto my beloved daughter Eliza Wooten five dollars with the increase of all that I have heretofore given her, to her her heirs and assigns for ever —

7<sup>th</sup> I give unto my daughter Rebekah Birring two negro names a little season and then with all that I have heretofore given her and other heretofore given her heirs and assigns for ever —

8<sup>th</sup> I give unto my beloved daughter E. B. John the following land that I purchased of Collet Bishop also the land that I purchased of the heirs of Thomas Eden esq<sup>r</sup> adjoining the same, also the land I purchased of the Hatch adjoining the same, also certain lands purchased in my own name adjoining the same — also two negro names Peter, Squire, Will, Johnson, Ellis, Abram, Little Sarah, Ann & Jim, one young boy names Charles, four Cows & Calves, six ewes and a lamb, two feather beds & furniture and the increase of the above named negroes to her and her heirs and assigns for ever —

9<sup>th</sup> I give unto my beloved son Edwin B. John the land that I purchased of John Edens son living on the north west side of flat swamp, also the land wherein I now live after the death of his mother, or marriage which ever may first happen, with all the residue of my Lands that I have not heretofore given away also six negro names, Peter, Tony, Sam, Minnow, Miley, and Charles — also one set of blacksmiths tools, two shot guns, one Dack, one surveyors compass and implements — one silver watch, with the increase of the above named negroes to her and her heirs and assigns for ever —

10<sup>th</sup> I give unto my son E. B. John two feather beds & furniture to her her heirs and assigns for ever —

11<sup>th</sup> It is my will and desire that old Mob and a Hoe should become a charge that my heirs shall support them their life time —

12<sup>th</sup> I direct that all the residue of my Estate to be sold by my Executrix and the money accounted to the sum of paying of all my debts, and if there should be a balance due the Estate I desire it should be equally divided among my wife and four youngest children —

13<sup>th</sup> I hereby nominate and appoint my wife beloved son in law Cornelius Wooten my Executrix to this my last Will & Testament desiring that he may put the same into execution and I do hereby revoke and disannul all former Wills by me heretofore made —

The paper writing purporting to be the last Will & Testament of William Borden deceased the 8<sup>th</sup> day of December A.D. 1833 is offered to the Court for probate by Council Master the executor therein named, and the same being duly proved by the oaths of Just. Weston Farmer and William Steffins to be all one very good writing as the hand writing of the said William Borden and it being further proved by the oaths of Carolina Borden that the same was found among the valuable papers of said Mr. after his death (Ms.) (in little deeds for loans) carefully locked up in a desk the said paper writing is adjudged to be duly proved as the last will & Testament of said William Borden and is admitted to probate accordingly — at the same time Council Master the Executor therein named was duly qualified as Executor thereto, and it is ordered that letters testamentary issue to said Council Master —
