

Be it known to all to whom it may concern, that I William Hoome of the County of Jones, and State of South Carolina, being infirm in health, but of proper mind and memory, do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following, that is as touching such worldly estate, as it hath pleased God to bless me with I will and dispose of followon. -

First I leave to my beloved Wife, during her life or Widowhood, all my land and plantations above Oldfields Branch below the grave yard, including the house and other conveniences therunto belonging, with the tract also on the River below said Branch, untill my son Michael Hoome, arrives to the age of twenty one Years, for her to rent out or otherwise to paying of a standing debt to the Widow, Eliza Hoome -

I also give and bequeath to my said beloved Wife Peter, two Cow. & Calves, or something her choice, and two Swine, and one Thousand Weight of Pork when fed - and twelve Barrels of Corn, with all my household & Kitchen furniture, and plantation tools, or as much thereof as she may think sufficient to keep house with, and the balance of my stock and other property to be disposed off, to the best advantage towards paying of my debt - with a wish, that my beloved Wife at her death, may leave all that I give her that remains at her death, to my daughter that survives her -

I will and bequeath to my son Michael Hoome at his arrival to the age of Twenty one Years, all that part of my land and plantations below Oldfields Branch as before mentioned, with all the other part of my land, that my Wife at her death or marriage to him may be his and assigns forever -

And last of all I constitute, make and ordain my beloved Wife Mary Hoome my executrix with my friend Spear Hoome Executor to this my last Will and Testament, Resolving all former Wills and confirming this - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 12th November 1824 -
