Appointed once for all men to die do make this my last
Will & Testament - Item I give to my beloved wife
Martha Collins one negro man named Harry day, also
four Choice Cows & Calves, also one Horse by the name of
Munch one man called Ladyboy & one yoke Oxen and
one feather Bed & furniture Seven head of Sheep fifteen
head of Hogs, two plows & a Tackling, two Pots, two Wheels,
one Wooling iron Linen, half dozen Linen & Crops & various
half dozen plates, one dish, half dozen chairs one Room
and all Stays & Harness belonging to the Room, one Chest
and one Mahogany Table, two Writing boxes, also one third
part of my manner plantation and Item I give to my
three daughters, Elsey Collins, Fanny Collins & Martha
Collins, three negroes by the names of Peter, Darby &
Bill to be equally divided amongst my said three
Daughters and the profits arising from said negroes
to be put together at my oldest Daughter coming to
full age a marriage and so until the youngest
does the same, also I give my daughter Elsey Collins
one man by the name of Pork, also one feather
Bed & furniture, one Cow & Calf by the name of
Holly - also I give to my daughter Fanny Collins one
feather Bed & furniture also my daughter Martha
one feather Bed & furniture etc

Item. I give to my two Sons Hardy Collins and
Benjamin Collins, all my right of my Stephen's
planation, also I give to my son Hardy Collins
two Cows & Calves by the name of Flower & Gunth, also
I give my son Hardy one man named Souper only he
is to pay Twenty dollars towards said man, also I give
my son Ben Collins, two Cows & Calves by name of Little
made Snub, also I give Hardy one hundred acres of Land
up the Black swamp, also I give Ben one plow etc

Item, I give my two sons Limmons Collins & Franklin
Collins all my manner plantation and the Lands ad-
joining to be rented out for their support every other
year all the rest of my Estate that is not already
settled to be sold for the support of my two youngest
sons and my youngest Daughter after all my just
Debt is paid, Also I Constitute and appoint my son
Benjamin Collins & William Rice my whole & sole
Executors to this my last Will & Testament, July 22 1812

I William Pele of Jones County in the State of North
Carolina being weak in body but of sound mind &
Memory do make & ordain this to be my last Will
and Testament in the manner & form following
that is to say - Item 1st It is my Will & desire
that all my Land with all my Personal Estate of
every Description (Except my negro woman Phillis)
Shall be sold at publick Auction to the highest
bidder - Item 2nd It is my Will & desire that my
negro woman Phillis shall be free and no more
to be a Slave to any person or persons whatever -
Item 3rd It is my Will and desire that my sum
and Charge with all my just debts be honestly
paid - Item 4th It is my will & desire that my
Beloved wife Bonner Pele and my Children
with my negro woman Phillis be allowed one
year provision to be delivered at the discretion of
my Executors - Item 5th It is my Will & desire
that my Executors take of my estate not exceeding
one Thousand Dollars, and purchase a piece of
Land there they may think best for a place of inter-
ment for my beloved wife Bonner Pele & my Children
for them to possess quietly during my wife's widow-
hood and my Children single life -
Item 6th It is my will & desire that should my
wife marry or die that the above piece of land
as mentioned in the fifth Item be sold to
highest bidder and the money arising
from such sale be equally divided between
my beloved wife & my Children -

54) Item 7. It is my Will & desire that the money
arising out of the sale of my property as above
mentioned in the first Item here and after the
purchase of the piece of land as mentioned in the
fifth Item and the payment of my just debts be
equally divided between my beloved Wife Bonita
Pate and my dearly beloved Children —

Item 8. I make and ordain beloved Wife Bonita
Pate and my worthy friend John M. Dunn of
Newbern to be Executors to this my last Will &
Testament. Witness my hand & seal this 8th day
of June 1812 —

Williamsburg District I William Garrison of
North Carolina Jones County do make Ordain
and declare this instrument as my last Will &
Testament revoking all others heretofore — —
I implore, It is my wish that all my just debts
be just paid — It is then my will & desire that
the remainder of my property be distributed in the
following manner, Item I leave to my mother
Lucinda Miller of North Carolina all the
property arising from the labour of my negroes Wind
Sarah & her two children George & Jim, and also
all the profits that may arise from the labour of
any children she may afterwards have during
her natural life, at her death it is my Will and
desire that the above named Wind Sarah and
her two children George & Jim together with all
their just increase be equally divided between all
the children of my brother James Garrison share
and share alike to them & their heirs for ever —
Item, I give to my brother Abner Garrison one
Bed & furniture now in possession of my mother
Lucinda Miller — all the remainder of my
property both in North Carolina & also at this time
in South Carolina, It is my will & desire that
it be equally divided between all my brothers &
sister to wit Wiley James, Mary & Abner — —
Partly I constitute and appoint my dearest beloved
brother James Garrison my only Executor to this
my last Will & Testament — In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal this Twenty
fifth day of May one thousand eight hundred
and twelve and in the thirty sixth year of the
Independence of the United States of America
